The Royal British Legion's Count Them In campaign aims to increase awareness and understanding by ensuring that the 2021 Census captures the relevant information on the Armed Forces community in order to better inform and shape the support organisations can provide in fully meeting the needs of the whole military community.

This Council therefore resolves to:

- Support the Royal British Legion's Count Them In campaign to ensure that crucial information can be gathered on the UK's significant Armed Forces community.
- Request that the **Deputy Leader** of the Council writes to the UK Government's Minister for the Constitution to request that the relevant questions be included in the 2021 Census.

Motor Neurone Disease (MND) is a fatal and rapidly progressing disease that affects the brain and spinal cord by attacking the nerves that control the body's movement, meaning that the disease can leave sufferers trapped in a body that is progressively unable to carry out the most basic of human functions - including an eventual failure to be able to breathe.

Around 5,000 adults from all communities and walks of life are affected at any one time in the UK, and, as there is currently no known cure for Motor Neurone Disease, it is important that those who suffer from the disease are given the care and respect they deserve. The MND Charter seeks to this by providing those suffering from the disease with a greater quality of life, dignity and respect for people with MND and their carers.

This Council therefore resolves to:

- Adopt the Motor Neurone Disease Association's MND Charter to help make a positive difference to the lives of people living with MND in our local community.
- Refer the issue to the Health and Well-being Scrutiny Committee for further consideration of the practical implications and how the Council can best implement the aims of the Charter.
