This Council notes its disappointment at the recent defeat of the Autism Bill at the National Assembly for Wales, a Bill that was developed in partnership with the National Autistic Society and received cross-party support. *(ADD – ‘The Council also notes the concerns of the five Colleges of Medicine and the Welsh NHS Confederations concerns that the Bill was not the best route for improving outcomes for individuals with ASD’.)*

Though this Council, of course, recognises that legislation alone is not the answer to improving access to services for those with autism in our communities, *(Delete – ‘by simply rejecting the Bill and without bringing forward a credible alternative, the Welsh Government is sending the wrong signal on this important subject’ AND INSERT – ‘steps to improve outcomes for individuals with ASD should be a priority for Welsh Ministers’.)*

This Council therefore resolves to:

- Request that the Leader of the Council writes to both the First Minister and the Minister for Health and Social Services, *(DELETE –‘outlining this Council’s concern at the recent defeat of this Bill, whilst also seeking reassurances that the Welsh Government will be bringing forward its own legislation on this issue’ AND INSERT- ‘to seek assurances from the Welsh Government that alternative solutions are put in place.’)*
- Request that the Health and Wellbeing Committee of this Council produce a piece of work in collaboration with relevant stakeholders, on what more this Council can do to support those living with autism in Rhondda Cynon Taff.

The tabled motion, as amended with Council agreement, would then read:

This Council notes the recent defeat of the Autism Bill at the National Assembly for Wales, a Bill that was developed in partnership with the National Autistic Society and received cross-party support. The Council also notes the concerns of the five Colleges of Medicine and the Welsh NHS Confederations concerns that the Bill was not the best route for improving outcomes for individuals with ASD.
