This Council seeks to express its concerns at the practical implications, changes to maternity services in Cwm Taf are creating for residents in Rhondda Cynon Taf.

This Council calls upon the Local Health Board to review the newly implemented arrangements in Cwm Taf, to reflect upon the difficulties this set-up is causing residents.

As part of this review, we request that the Local Health Board, consider the significant housing development which has already taken place since the original decision in 2013. This review should also consider proposals for future housing, particularly in the South of this County Borough, North and Bridgend areas.

It is the view of this Council that these developments will place further pressure upon this new service arrangement and in turn cause further practical consequences for the residents of RCT, who need to access maternity & paediatric services, particularly in emergency situations.
