Re: - Executive Response to the Environment and Housing Scrutiny Working Group Recommendations

1. The Service Director, Planning recommends Communal waste collection areas be provided within future developments of flats and communal housing.

The Service Director, Planning has undertaken some research into recent planning applications for flats and it appears that some form of refuse storage has been incorporated at planning stage into the majority of the proposals. In addition, the Planning Service is currently in the process of preparing Supplementary Planning Guidance (SPG) for flats developments. It proposed to work closely with the Streetcare Service so that the guidance provides detailed advice to ensure that suitable refuse and recycling facilities are incorporated into flats developments at planning application stage.

In the meantime Planning Officers will continue to work with applicants to encourage the incorporation of refuse and recycling facilities in new flats developments.
