1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

The purpose of the report is to update Members on relevant issues, with regard to

- the Licensing Act 2003
- the Gambling Act 2005

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

Members are requested to: -

- (i) note the contents of the report in respect of the **Licensing Act 2003** which has been provided for information;
- (ii) note the contents of the report in respect of the **Gambling Act 2005**, which has been provided for information;

3. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that a quarterly meeting is convened to review and discuss the implementation and progress of the Licensing Act 2003, together with any ancillary matters arising from responsibilities with which this particular Committee is charged.

Such ancillary matters include the Gambling Act 2005. (There may also be ancillary matters arising from the impact of the Smoke-Free Premises Regulations, which have the potential to affect all licensed premises).

4. <u>LICENSING ACT 2003</u>

4.1 Application Process

Applications received since the last update (6th October 2014 to 4th January 2015) are as follows:-

Summary of TEN's, reproduced as Appendix 1A.

Analysis of TEN'S applications indicates 40 were for Private Members Clubs; 11 for Community events and 37 for existing Premises Licences. No events were a cause of concern to the Licensing Authority in this period. The primary use of TENs continues to be the enhancement of licensable activity at existing licensed premises, with a relatively small number being utilised for Community led events. Of particular note for this period was the number of TENs received requesting alternative hours for Christmas Day at various convenience stores in the Borough.

However, it is anticipated that there will be a continuing reduction in the use of TENs, as evidenced to date by the impact of the Live Music Act and the recent deregulation of some aspects of entertainment.

A comparison of TENs for a three year period confirms a reduction of uptake of some 16% from 2012 to 2014. A summary of the pattern of usage for the period 1st January 2012 to 31st December 2014 is reproduced for information as **Appendix 1B**

There are also proposals to amend provisions for TENs to make them 'less onerous' and 'more attractive' to Community organisations, albeit proposals are yet to be finalised.

Included in the deregulation proposals is the introduction of a CAN (Community Ancillary Sellers Notice), which is intended as a mechanism to permit low volume retail sale of alcohol for certain types of businesses. It would

apply primarily to small businesses, such as Florists for example, where the business proprietor wishes to supply alcohol ancillary to their main business. It is intended to operate as a lower level of authorisation to that of a TEN, (in a different trading environment), but has not been favourably received by Licensing Authorities at the time of consultation. (Final proposals are currently awaited).

In accordance with the advice received in respect of data protection matters, the summaries of Personal Licences and Premises Licences issued under delegated authority are now reproduced for information as a Part II restricted item.

(i) Megasave Supermarkets Ltd

The premise was the subject of Review by South Wales Police as a result of the significant number of crimes reported associated with the premises. Whilst some of the crimes were alcohol related such as thefts from the store, there were also a disproportionate number of crimes associated with racial harassment of staff.

The Police had attempted to engage the assistance of the premises management on numerous occasions in order to investigate offences and prosecute perpetrators. In addition the Hate Crime Officer had also initiated a programme of support, in order to eliminate the unacceptable behaviour being experienced. Investigation of offences resulted in identification of unsatisfactory management practices, which were considered to be a contributory factor to the occurrence of offences. The lack of confidence in management control, combined with the reticence of the management to fully co-operate with Police Officers was considered to undermine the licensing objective for prevention of crime & disorder in a wider context, which was perceived as contributing to a negative impact on the community.

Following consideration of evidence presented, Members resolved that the premises Licence be revoked.

The Licensee subsequently appealed the decision and the outcome of the matter is yet to be determined at Magistrates Court.

(ii) The Raj (Now Trading as Le Delhi Lounge)

The review was initiated by the Licensing Authority (acting in its role as Responsible Authority) and is a good example of a low level intervention which resulted in a satisfactory outcome.

The premises was the subject of a routine inspection visit which identified an absent DPS and persons in control of the business which differed to that recorded by Licensing and Food Safety Teams. In addition, information provided to respective officers was inconsistent, which resulted in a lack of confidence in management control.

As a result of a failure to engage with Officers, it was determined that the review was necessary in order to regularise management control. Following service of the review, an application was received for the transfer of the Premises Licence and the appointment of an alternative DPS. Following subsequent inspection of the premises, which proved satisfactory, it was possible to deal with the review on an administrative basis following a scheduled hearing for a separate premises.

The above mentioned premises was the subject of a Review of Premises Licence which required a considerable resource commitment from partner agencies, but which was not subsequently determined by the Licensing Sub Committee and otherwise may not be reported.

The premises was associated with alcohol related anti social behaviour and poor management control, being the subject of concern to Police, Community Safety, Licensing, UK Border Agency and Trading Standards.

The Police initiated the Review of the Premises Licence following a joint visit with Licensing Team colleagues where several matters of non –compliance were identified including an absent DPS. The matters of non-compliance are currently the subject of an on-going investigation and therefore limited comment can be made in this respect.

Police, Trading Standards and Licensing Authority (Acting as Responsible Authority) collectively expressed a view that the poor management control exercised at the premises was not only failing to promote the licensing objectives, but combined with a lack of social responsibility demonstrated by the Licensee in respect of the management of the business was having an adverse impact on the community in which it traded.

A view was expressed by Police and partner agencies that the trading activity of the premises was a contributory factor to the levels of alcohol related anti-social behaviour and crime & disorder which was prevalent in the immediate vicinity. As a result of the information presented, the Licensing Committee report prepared for the hearing recommended revocation of the licence.

However, shortly before the matter was scheduled for hearing and having considered the content of the report, the legal representative of the Licensee advised the Licensing Authority that the Premises Licence was to be surrendered. Following completion of the transaction, the Review was withdrawn and the hearing deemed unnecessary. Whilst it may appear that a considerable resource was wasted in dealing with the matter, it is considered that a satisfactory outcome was achieved by the partner agencies in securing the removal of the licence and the cessation of retail alcohol sales from the premises.

The business of the convenience store continues to trade, now rebranded as 'Ponty Convenience Store'. However, the absence of the alcohol licence and unsatisfactory practices associated with sales has resulted in a significant improvement in the number of anti-social behaviour referrals received by the Community Safety Team for the area and an overall improvement in the adverse impact previously experienced by the community.

The introduction of a Consent Order is a relatively new process to the licensing regime and reflects the promotion of a culture of mutual consent, where litigation and appearance before the Court is deemed to be a 'last resort'.

It is recognised in this climate of shrinking resources, that parties do not necessarily require a contested hearing before the Court in order to reach a mutually acceptable agreement, particularly where there is a change in position. It is accepted however, that there will be circumstances where such agreement cannot be reached in the absence of a hearing.

A brief overview of the particular circumstances of each matter is provided for information as follows:-

(i) Mountain Ash Service Station, Mountain Ash

The applicant requested an extension of licensable activity to permit 24 hour trading. Concerns were expressed by Responsible Authorities as to the impact on the neighbouring residential community, mindful of the level of management control that would be necessary to mitigate any adverse impact. Conditions were imposed by the Licensing Sub Committee which required a minimum level of training required for staff. However, subsequent to the hearing it was confirmed by the Applicant that such minimum training standards were already part of company policy and therefore the condition was considered unnecessary.

Following liaison with the Chairman of the Licensing Committee it was agreed that the terms of the licence could be revised in recognition of the new information presented.

(ii) Bargain Booze, Beddau

The application provided for a new Premises Licence for an Off Licence at Commercial Street, Beddau. Following public consultation there was a significant response from the community that the business was undesirable as result of significant alcohol related anti social behaviour already being experienced.

Responsible Authorities responded to community concerns with representations regarding the proposals, albeit at that time there was limited complaint history in respect of the anti social behaviour reported anecdotally.

In addition, there was an error during the consultation process which resulted in a legal challenge to the admission of information deemed to be received after the expiry of the consultation period. This resulted in the exclusion of such information.

Following legal advice, the application was determined by the Licensing Sub Committee during an extended hearing, which also included a site visit. On the basis of evidence before them, Members resolved that the licence be granted but subject to robust conditions which included provision of Door Staff at key trading times.

The Applicant considered such requirements to be disproportionate, particularly in view of the excellent trading record the company could evidence at a similar premises in a neighbouring Borough. However, the Licensing Committee considered the local environment and deemed the condition reasonable & appropriate at the time the decision was made.

Initially, it was proposed to defend the matter at Court. However, the Responsible Authorities, quickly established a partnership initiative to assess the extent of the alcohol related anti social behaviour being reported by the community.

This commenced with a meeting with all licensees trading in the area to explain concerns and request co-operation. This was followed by individual inspection of all premises to provide advice, guidance and ensure compliance. It is pleasing to note that the majority of premises were compliant and minor issues identified were addressed with the co-operation of licensees. This included the upgrading of CCTV at one licensed premises and the installation of a local authority managed CCTV camera at an identified 'hot spot' location at Commercial Street.

Having successfully engaged with the licensed trade, the next stage was to address the community and this was done by the convening of a special PACT meeting for the purpose. It is fair to say that the community were wholly dissatisfied with the licensing process which resulted in the grant of the licence and the commencement of trading of the business. Views were expressed in a vociferous manner and Officers criticised for the error which rendered the representations of the community inadmissible.

Following the PACT meeting, a survey of the community was conducted, focussed on those 275 persons who had signed a petition against the granting of the licence. The purpose of the survey was to establish the time/frequency/location of the behaviour that was reported as the cause of concern as there was only limited complaint history in this respect.

A copy of the survey form is reproduced for information as **Appendix 1C**

Unfortunately, the survey response was only 13.8%, with only 38 respondents returning survey forms. Having analysed the responses, only 9 persons, 23 % gave specific detail of problems experienced.

Having regard to all the data available, from partner agencies and the Licensing Authority it was apparent that the public perception of the alcohol related antisocial behaviour prior to the application was somewhat different to that which now existed and could be evidenced.

Partner agencies were of the view that following the organised intervention in the area and the assessment undertaken it would not be reasonable to maintain their position in respect of defence of the pending appeal regarding the conditions imposed on the premises licence.

In addition, the premises had been inspected and monitored over the initial trading period and found to be satisfactory. Notwithstanding that there continued to be low level anti social behaviour in the area, it was considered that this was not a licensing related matter and existing mechanisms to deal with behaviour identified would continue via alternative agencies.

In view of the foregoing and following an approach from the Premises Licensee/Appellant it was agreed that the terms of the licence be varied to remove the condition requiring Door Staff on key days.

At the time of preparing this report Officers are scheduled to attend the next local PACT meeting to provide an update to the community on Wednesday 14th January 2015. Assurance will be given that the work will continue in respect of any problems identified, but it is also important that the community work with the Authority in bringing concerns to the attention of partner agencies promptly. In this way enforcement action can be taken or alternative interventions can be made without delay where appropriate.

4.5 Compliance & Enforcement

(i) Prosecutions

Details of Prosecutions under the Licensing Act 2003 are reproduced for information as **Appendix 1D.**

(ii) Test Purchasing

35 Test Purchase were carried out in the period, resulting in 3 sales to young persons, a failure rate of 8.5%. 2 Fixed Penalty Notices were served to salespersons and all Premises Licensees subject to interview. All sales were made at convenience stores and investigation is ongoing. Further comment will be made at outcome of respective investigations

(iii) Partnership Working

The majority of the partnership working for this period has been involved with the 'Beddau/Ty Nant Project' and the concerns of the community regarding alcohol related anti-social behaviour.

This has involved the Police, Trading Standards and Community Safety Team in particular with the following activities:

- reviewing anti-social behaviour intelligence to establish whether there was a link with alcohol;
- conducting observations & foot patrols at key times of reported concern;
- visiting licensed premises and engaging with young persons in immediate vicinity;
- assisting with preparation of the community survey with complimentary analysis of responses received;
- arranging a Community Impact survey in order to permit installation of CCTV camera at Commercial Street.

Officers have also assisted Licensing Team with a variety of test purchases in both alcohol licensed premises and Taxis, resulting in successful outcomes for identification of unlicensed activity.

(iv) Premises Inspection & Infringements

12 premises inspections have been completed this period and a summary of infringements identified is reproduced as **Appendix 1E.**

The inspection programme is currently under review and further comment in respect of revised proposals will be made at the next meeting.

4.6 Legislative Changes – Renewal of Personal Licences

Members will be aware that all Personal Licences issues under the Licensing Act 2003 are valid for a period of 10 years, (unless suspended/ revoked). Given that the regime was introduced in November 2005, this means that licences issued at the inception of the process would ordinarily require renewal, commencing 2015.

However, as part of the deregulation proposals Licensing Authorities have been advised of the intention to remove the requirement for such licences to require renewal. There is a proposal for licences to be extended to an undetermined date, (in a similar manner to that which applies to Premises Licences), where the licence will continue unless subject to enforcement action requiring suspension or revocation.

The process for review of Personal Licences has been subject to review and consultation and as a result proposals to amend the minimum qualification required has been withdrawn. Whilst the proposal to extend existing licences is maintained, secondary legislation is required to effect the change. At the time of preparing this report, indications are that the legislative change required will not be implemented in time for those licences due to expire in early 2015. As a result an interim process of renewal has been notified to Licensing Authorities to ensure continuity of the process.

The 'fast track' process for renewal provides for a brief application form, without supporting documentation and payment of a fee will NOT be required. Advice is given that provided a VALID application for renewal is made, the Personal Licence will be deemed to be EXTENDED, subject to determination by the Licensing Authority. This is intended to preserve the position of the licensee and allow the Licensing Authority reasonable opportunity to process what are potentially a large number of applications over a relatively short period.

A timeframe for renewal applications has been established which requires application to be made NO MORE THAN 3 MONTHS and NO LESS THAN 1 MONTH BEFORE EXPIRY DATE. However, application for renewal MUST be made or the licence will lapse.

Guidance notes have been prepared for licensees and will shortly be available on the Council's Website, complimented by local advice regarding the process.

A copy of the guidance supplied by the Home Office is reproduced for information as **Appendix 1F**.

A review of Personal Licences in Rhondda Cynon Taf confirms the following:

- Number of Current Licences 2180
- Number of Licences due to expire (1/2/15 31/10/15) 706
- Number of Licences currently subject to endorsement 112

Indications are that secondary legislation will be in place by June 2015 but this is by no means certain. As a result preparations are in hand to deal with potential renewal applications, at least for the period to 31/10/15.

Renewals will be considered on a phased approach, profiled on a monthly basis by expiry date, where a reminder letter regarding expiry will be sent by the Licensing Team. This will ensure that the minimum level of resource required is devoted to the process, whilst maintaining the integrity of the system subject to the change in legislation.

Whilst the process in intended to be 'light touch', there will be applications where licensees have been convicted of relevant offences which may generate representation from South Wales Police. Such applications will require a hearing before the Licensing Sub Committee and this will clearly have an impact on workload.

Further comment will be made at the next meeting as the process evolves. However, advice to the licensed community should be to check their licence expiry date and contact the Licensing Team for further advice as soon as possible.

4.7 Recovery of Annual Fees

The position to date for 2014/15 is as follows:-

The suspension of Premises Licences as a mechanism for recovery of annual fees continues. To date 21 licences have been suspended, but several such licences refer to premises which are not currently trading and consequently there is no impact to the licensee in respect of trading activity. Recovery of the debt in such circumstances is then dealt with under usual debt recovery processes, outside of the Licensing Act 2003.

However, as the process evolves and licensees become aware of the prospect of cessation of trading, payments are being generated by initial warning letters that are required as a statutory part of the process.

To date approximately 89 warning letters have been issued, which have generated 38 payments. However, this does not necessarily mean that 51 premises have unpaid fees that will generate suspensions. There is frequently a time lapse between a payment being made and it appearing in payment systems as 'received'. The process therefore provides for a 7 day period for recording of activity prior to suspension of a licence.

3 enforcement visits have been made to date in respect of suspended licences, but no offences have been identified, payment either having been made or trading ceased.

5.3 Enforcement

The Gambling Commission recently provided a training update for members of the Licensing Team, at no cost to the Authority. The training was well received and of mutual benefit to both partners, providing a legislative update to Officers in respect of Gaming Machine Categories and also an opportunity to explore concerns regarding use of Fixed Odds Betting Terminals in licensed Betting Premises.

(i) Gaming Machine Seizure

Shortly following the training, Officers had the opportunity to put their knowledge into practice. An enquiry was received from the Chairman of a 'Qualifying Members Club' in the Cynon Valley who requested advice regarding a gaming machine recently installed at their premises.

Licensing Officers were invited to visit the premises to inspect the machine and it was found NOT to be compliant with Gambling Act 2005.

At the request of the premises management the machine was surrendered to the Licensing Authority to facilitate investigation. Liaison with the Gambling Commission will continue regarding the provenance of the machine and the Licensing Authority were complimented on their swift action in removing it from circulation. Further comment on the outcome of the investigation will be provided at a future meeting.

(ii) Potential Proxy Sale (illegal betting)

Licensing Officers received a complaint that young persons in the Gilfach Goch area were approaching legitimate customers of a local Betting Shop and requesting that bets be placed on their behalf. Investigation of the complaint included South Wales Police (local NPT Officer), Trading Standards and Licensing Officers. The management of the premises were also very happy to assist the investigation to ensure that the licensing objective for protection of children from harm was not compromised, which could also have had an adverse impact on the reputation of the business.

Officers attended the premises in question and conducted a review of management protocols, refusal registers etc and were satisfied at the level of control exercised. Indeed processes in place were consistent with best practice and Officers had excellent confidence in management capability.

Having considered the presence of young persons in the immediate vicinity, a decision was take to increase minimum staffing levels on key days in order to provide additional protection. It was also agreed that there would be ongoing liaison with partner agencies to attempt to identify the young persons involved and provide appropriate guidance.

6 Recovery of Annual Fees

As a result of the static nature of the trade, there is little change to the position, where 100% recovery of annual fees is the standard, primarily due to the robust provisions contained within the legislation which allow for withdrawal of the licence/permit for non-payment of appropriate fees.

New arrangements for personal licences due for renewal in 2015

Factsheet for licence holders

The Government is aiming to remove the requirement for personal licence holders to renew their licence every 10 years through the Deregulation Bill, which is currently before Parliament. The first personal licences were granted in February 2005. However, the Bill is unlikely to receive Royal Assent before the tenth anniversary of the date on which the first personal licences were granted. To ensure that personal licence holders are not disadvantaged by this position, the Government will introduce new arrangements through secondary legislation for those whose licences are due for renewal before the proposal in the Bill comes into force.

We will alter the application form to renew a licence so that licence holders are required to provide only essential information to the licensing authority. The application form will be available in due course, as soon as the legislation is approved by Parliament.

Applicants must complete the form and submit it to their licensing authority no later than one month before their licence expires. They will also have to enclose their licence or a copy. Section 119 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that where an application for renewal is pending and the application has not been determined before the licence expires, the licence continues to have effect. To ensure that applicants have certainty that their forms have been received, licensing authorities should acknowledge receipt of the application.

The Deregulation Bill is being considered by Parliament and the timescales described in this Fact Sheet depend on, and are subject to, the Parliamentary process. We cannot therefore give an exact date as to when the repeal of the requirement to renew a personal licence will take effect, assuming that the relevant provisions in the Deregulation Bill continue to form part of the Bill.

How do I know if I am affected?

Your personal licence will have an expiry date. If the expiry date is in early 2015, you will need to apply for a renewal. You may apply three months before the expiry date, but no later than one month before the expiry date.

When will the repeal of the requirement to renew take effect?

The Deregulation Bill is being considered by Parliament and the timescales depend on, and are subject to, the Parliamentary process. We cannot therefore give an exact date as to when the repeal of the requirement to renew a personal licence will take effect, assuming that the relevant provisions in the Deregulation Bill continue to form part of the Bill.

When will the form be available?

The form is not yet available. Changes must be made in secondary legislation and this must be agreed by Parliament. You will be able to access the form from your licensing authority's website in due course. This will also be available on the gov.uk website.

What information will I need to provide?

Personal licence holders will each need to submit a completed form to the licensing authority. Applicants will **not** have to enclose a processing fee, a criminal convictions certificate, criminal record certificate or the results of a subject access search of the Police National Computer.

You will need to send your existing licence to the licensing authority. Individual licensing authorities can decide whether applicants are required to submit the original licence or a

copy (e.g. a scanned version or a photocopy) and you should check your licensing authority's requirements before you apply.

Why do I have to provide my licence?

The Licensing Act 2003 requires a personal licence holder to provide their licence with the application to renew, or state a reason why it is not practicable to provide the licence.

Can I submit a photocopy or a scanned copy of the licence? Does it have to be the original?

Individual licensing authorities can decide whether applicants are required to submit the original licence or a copy (e.g., a scanned version or a photocopy). You should check your licensing authority's requirements before you apply as this may affect the way in which applications can be sent.

Which licensing authority should the application be sent to?

The application must be submitted to the licensing authority which granted the original licence. The name of the licensing authority will be stated on the licence. Contact details are available on their website.

Do I need to send a copy of the application to the police?

No. The application should be sent to the licensing authority only.

How much will it cost?

There will be no charge for renewal. Licensing authorities may make a charge of £10.50 to cover administrative costs if you ask for a new licence to be issued, for example to change your address.

Can I apply online?

No. The application must be submitted by post or email.

Can I apply by post?

Yes. You can apply by email or by post. You will have to supply your licence to the licensing authority. Licensing authorities will be able to confirm if they will require the original licence or a copy.

Can I apply by email

Yes, but you should check first with the licensing authority who granted you the licence as to whether they will accept a scanned copy of your licence.

When do I need to submit my application?

You should wait until the form is available. Your application for renewal will need to be submitted no earlier than three months before it is due to expire, and no later than one month before it is due to expire.

What if I apply for a renewal less than one month before my licence is due to expire? Your application will not be valid. Your licence will lapse and you will have to apply for a new licence.

What happens if I do nothing?

Personal licences which are due to expire before the requirement to renew is abolished by the Deregulation Bill <u>must be renewed</u>. Failure to do so will mean that the licence will expire. The abolition of the requirement to renew is subject to Parliamentary process.

What will the licensing authority send me?

The licensing authority will acknowledge your application and return your licence to you, if you sent the original.

What do I do if I need to change my name and address?

You need to notify the licensing authority which issued your licence. They will issue you with an updated licence, and there will be a charge of £10.50 for this.

My photo no longer looks like me.

If a police officer or licensing officer needs to verify your identity they may request a separate piece of identification, for example a driving licence.

I have been convicted of a relevant offence since my personal licence was granted, what should I do?

You should have notified the court of the fact that you are a personal licence holder at the time. Following conviction you should have provided the licensing authority that issued the licence with details of the conviction and sentence. Failure to notify the court and licensing authority are offences under section 128 and 132 of the Licensing Act 2003. You should contact the court and also notify the licensing authority which issued the licence.

I can't find my personal licence or details.

You should contact the licensing authority which issued your licence. If you cannot find your licence - and providing it has not expired - you may apply for a duplicate copy.

I don't want to renew my personal licence.

If you don't wish to renew your personal licence then you do not need to apply for a renewal. Your licence will automatically lapse and you will be unable to be a designated premises supervisor or authorise the sale of alcohol after the expiry date on the licence.

What will happen if the licensing authority does not acknowledge receipt of my application?

You should contact the licensing authority to ensure they have received your application. We expect licensing authorities to issue written acknowledgement (for example an email or a letter) which you should keep as a record.

Will I receive a new licence?

No. Licensing authorities are not required to issue a new licence but may choose to do so for clarity.

My personal licence has an expiry date – does that mean it will expire?

Licenses with an expiry date will remain valid after they have been renewed.

How will I prove that my licence is still valid if it contains an expiry date?

You may use the acknowledgement from the licensing authority as proof that the licence has been renewed.
