NEW HACKNEY CARRIAGE TARIFFS FOR RCT

REPORT OF DIRECTOR - PUBLIC HEALTH, PROTECTION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES

1. <u>PURPOSE OF THE REPORT</u>

1.1 The purpose of the report is to seek approval for new tariffs in respect of Hackney Carriage journeys carried out by Hackney Carriages vehicles licenced to operate within the County Borough of Rhondda Cynon Taf.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

2.1 It is recommended that approval is given to implement the new hackney carriage tariffs for Hackney Carriages licensed to operate in Rhondda Cynon Taf with an effective commencement date of the 31st August 2022.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 makes provision for a Council to set a prescribed rate or table of fares (tariff) operable within their district.
- 3.2 This provision applies only to Hackney Carriages, as Private Hire Vehicles are deemed to be hired under a separate provision that does not afford the regulation of fares.
- 3.3 Since the inception of Rhondda Cynon Taf on the 1st April 1996 (Local Government Reorganisation), the Council has elected to operate a specified tariff of fares.
- 3.4 The tariff is a directive of the maximum charge that may be made. Licensees may charge below that rate (should market forces or conscience dictate) but must not charge in excess of it.
- 3.5 Consequently, the tariff does not dictate how licensees operate their business but does provide an element of protection for members of the public.
- 3.6 It is a condition that:
 - (i) The current tariff be displayed in a licensed vehicle.
 - (ii) The Taxi Meter in a vehicle be programmed with the current tariff, as approved by the Licensing Authority.

- 3.7 It is recognised that there is limited public awareness as to the tariff structure and it is difficult to calculate the cost of the proposed journey. However, the display on the Taxi Meter indicates to the passenger the maximum fare that can be charged for their journey.
- 3.8 The Licensing Authority should ensure that a review of taxi meter tariffs within the Borough is undertaken every 3 years, subject to extenuating circumstances that may require consideration of an earlier review.

4. OVERVIEW OF REVIEW

- 4.1 The 'Unite' taxi union have requested consideration of the current tariff for meter charges on Hackney Carriages.
- 4.2 The last Hackney Carriage meter rate increase within Rhondda Cynon Taf was in 2012, almost a decade ago and much has changed since then.
- 4.3 Requirements for cleaner & greener vehicles are pivotal for the Authority in its aim to become a carbon neutral Authority. This is in line with electric vehicle charging strategy 2021-2030.
- 4.4 The recent pandemic has caused the taxi trade to suffer losses in income which has had a further impact on the ability to purchase vehicles that will be compliant with the aim and ambition of Welsh Government and RCT Council. Such vehicles come at a much higher cost to the drivers and operators. These costs depend on whether the vehicles are fully electric, hybrid or even Euro 6 compliant.
- 4.5 Since the last increase in meter rates for RCT licensed Hackney vehicles, the cost of operating a hackney carriage has risen dramatically. In July 2012, the average petrol price was £1.32 per litre. Diesel was £1.37 per litre. As of April 1^{st,} 2022, petrol averages at £1.63 and diesel at £1.77 per litre. (source <u>www.racfoundation.org</u>)
- 4.6 This represents at 23.5% increase in petrol costs and a 29.4% increase in diesel costs, based purely on date-to-date comparison.
- 4.7 The <u>AA Fuel Price Report</u> shows that the cost of diesel has increased from a Wales average of 122.2p per litre in March 2018 to 151.0p per litre in February 2022. Unleaded 95 Octane petrol has also increased during the same period from 119.3p per litre to 147.2p per litre. It should be noted that since February 2022 (the latest AA fuel report available at time of writing) the cost of fuel has risen significantly.
- 4.8 Inflation as measured by the Retail Price Index averaged 3.1 across 2012. Today, RPI inflation sits at 8.2% and the lesser CPI at 6.2%. Inflation across the whole of 2021 alone was 7.5%. The 6.2% inflation rate for the CPI in the United Kingdom is at a 30-year high.
- 4.9 The current fee for Tariff 1 per two mile is £5.20, this is the lowest of all neighbouring authorities surrounding the Borough and well below the UK national average of £6.17.
- 4.10 The proposed Tariffs are outlined below. The proposed tariff 1 for two miles is £5.80, which is considered by officers to be a proportionate increase and is supported by the consultation undertaken with the trade and public, however this remains below

the UK national average of £6.17, which can be seen in the 'National Hackney Fares table' taken from private hire monthly magazine (copy attached as **Appendix 1**).

Proposed Taxi Meter Increase

Below is a comparison table for current RCT tariffs and the proposed tariffs, indicating a journey based on 2 miles, 5 miles and 10 miles.

<u>**Tariff 1 (up to 4 passengers)**</u> increase from £3.60 base rate and $1/16^{th}$ to £4.00 base rate and $1/18^{th}$ thereafter.

Tariff 5 is double the rate for tariff 1.

Tariff 6 is double the rate for tariff 3.

- Fouling of the vehicle to increase from £45.00 to £55.00.
- Waiting time to increase from £13.00 to £15.00.

- Christmas Day and New Year's Day double tariff 1 and 3 to start at the following times:
 - 6pm Christmas Eve to midnight Christmas Day.
 - 6pm New Year's Eve to midnight New Year's Day.
- 4.11 The table below shows a comparison for Welsh Local Authorities on Tariff 1, 2 mile average as of April 2022, including the year they were last amended, though some of these are under review and may be subject to increases. The Welsh national average based on the below table is £5.72, though this is likely to increase due to other Authorities reviewing their rates.

4.12 Explanation of each tariff is as follows:

Tariff 1	Prices apply during hours of 7am - 7pm (for 1- passengers)
Tariff 2	Prices apply during hours of 7pm - 7am + Sundays & Bank holidays (for 1-4 passengers)
Tariff 3	Prices apply during hours of 7am - 7pm (for 5-8 passengers)
Tariff 4	Prices apply during hours of 7pm - 7am + Sundays & Bank holidays (for 5-8 passengers)
Tariff 5	Double tariff 1 on Christmas & New Year
Tariff 6	Double tariff 3 on Christmas & New Year

5. EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS

5.1 An Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) form has been prepared for the purpose of this report. It is deemed the impact of this tariff rise has a neutral effect as it does not put any person at a disadvantage because of their protected characteristic.

6. WELSH LANGUAGE IMPLICATIONS

6.1 A Welsh Language Impact assessment has been completed. It is deemed that the amendments proposed are demographic neutral and will not negatively impact on Welsh language.

7. FINANCIAL IMPLICATION(S)

7.1 This report does not have any financial implications for the Council as it relates to charges levied by the hackney carriage trade for journeys the public pay to undertake in their vehicles.

8. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS OR LEGISLATION CONSIDERED

8.1 Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 was considered which provides legislation for setting of fares for Hackney Carriages.

9. <u>LINKS TO THE CORPORATE AND NATIONAL PRIORITIES AND THE WELL-</u> <u>BEING OF FUTURE GENERATIONS ACT</u>

- 9.1 The Hackney Carriage & Private Hire Vehicle trade provides an essential service to all members of the public. It is inclusive of all including those who are vulnerable and those with disabilities, for whom wheelchair accessible vehicles can be utilised.
- 9.2 A safe and suitable taxi fleet is instrumental in assisting to sustain a vibrant economy. Licensed vehicles are used to transport children to schools, by the public to attend medical appointments, for shopping, to go on vacation and assists in transporting people home safely within the night-time economy.

- 9.3 This report has been considered for evidence of the Five Ways of Working and how it may contribute to our Well-being Objectives.
 - <u>Prevention and collaboration</u>: the purpose of this regulatory function is to protect the public through approved meter tariffs.
 - <u>Involvement:</u> Any increase in taxi fares is subject to public consultation before the Council may consider any changes.
 - <u>Collaboration</u>: The Licensing department meets regularly with 'Unite' union who representative a large number of the taxi trade within RCT, to discuss topics relevant to the trade.

10. CONSULTATION

- 10.1 The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 states consultation is required for 14 days on any changes to tariffs. A consultation commenced on 16th June 2022, with advertisements posted in Pontypridd Observer, Rhondda Leader and Cynon Leader. The taxi trade within RCT were all sent details electronically.
- 10.2 Only three comments were received during the consultation process, all from the trade. Only one of the comments provides relative information and feedback. All comments can be seen at **Appendix 2**.
- 10.3 There are no public objections.
- 10.4 The consultation has not provided any significant concerns that require reconsideration of the draft proposal that was subject to consultation.

11. CONCLUSION

- 11.1 The Tariffs in RCT have not been reviewed for 10 years; during this time much has changed including the fuel prices being the highest in history, maintenance of vehicles and the unprecedented pandemic which has had an adverse impact on the costs associated with operating hackney carriage vehicles.
- 11.2 It is proposed that the increase in tariffs is approved to enable the taxi trade to be able to be viable in their business, which in turn provides a service to the community.
- 11.3 Other nearby local authorities have or are increasing their rates. Without an increase in RCT rates there is a high probability that drivers will either leave the trade altogether or get licensed in other local authorities. It is considered that the proposed increase is proportionate and reasonable.

We have a query with the new proposed Tariffs.

The proportional difference in the increase at Tariff 2 between 1-4 Seaters and 5 - 8 Seaters is NOT comparable and will not give any 1- 4 seater cars any incentive to work in the evenings.

<u>5 - 8 Seater</u>

20p per 1/10mile = \pounds 2.00 per mile - CURRENT RATE 20p per 1/12 mile = \pounds 2.40 per mile - PROPOSED RATE

The easiest way to show this is by looking at a 10 mile journey

The below table shows the difference between the current Tariffs and proposed Tariffs

CAR (1 - 4 Seats) MPV/ 8 Seaters (5 - 8 Seats) Original T1 £18.00 Original T3 £20.70 Proposed T1 £20.20 Proposed T3 £23.00

Difference £2.20 Difference £2.30

Original T2 £20.10 Original T4 £22.90 Proposed T2 £22.50 Proposed T4 £27.00

Difference £2.40 Difference £4.10

The above table shows that a Car (1 - 4 seats) Driver has an incentive of just \pounds 2.30 to drive 10 miles (an increase of 20p from previous rate) in the evening opposed to a MPV/ 8 Seater Driver who has an incentive of \pounds 4.00 to drive in the evening (an increase of \pounds 1.80 from previous rate).

This does not give any incentive for a car (1 - 4 seats) to work in the evenings at this rate, leaving our elderly and vulnerable community once again disadvantaged as access issues into the large vehicles are an issue for them.

It can easily be seen from the below table the increases are not consistent

T1 T2 T3 T4

Current £1.60 £1.80 £1.80 £2.00 - 20p increments

Proposed £1.80 £2.00 £2.00 £2.40 - 20p increments with exception of T4

There is already a problem with the public not being able to get a taxi in the evenings and this will just add to the problem of incentivising the cars to work in the evenings Can you come back to me please regarding the justification of this differential for Tariff 4
