COUNCIL INVESTMENT PRIORITIES – MID YEAR REVIEW – SUPPLEMENTARY CAPITAL PROGRAMME FOR HIGHWAYS, TRANSPORTATION AND STRATEGIC PROJECTS

REPORT OF THE GROUP DIRECTOR CORPORATE AND FRONTLINE SERVICES IN DISCUSSIONS WITH THE LEADER OF THE COUNCIL, CLLR A MORGAN.

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1. <u>PURPOSE OF THE REPORT</u>

Further to the approval by Council of the Council Investment Priorities – Mid Year Review on 28th of October 2015, this report seeks approval of the detailed capital programme for the Highways and Streetcare Service in accordance with the Investment Priorities under; Roads and Structures and Transportation Infrastructure.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

It is recommended that Cabinet:

2.1 Note and approve the Supplementary Capital Programme detailing Investment Priorities for Roads and Structures and Transportation Infrastructure as detailed within this report.

3. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

- 3.1 In order to provide the necessary detail for consideration by Cabinet this supplementary paper is submitted providing the detail of the Investment Priorities for the following areas;
 - Roads and Structures
 - Transportation Infrastructure

4. <u>SUPPLEMENTARY CAPITAL PROGRAMME</u>

4.1 **Roads and Structures**

The Highways Network represents the most significant asset of the Council, valued in excess of £3.4Bn and comprises of carriageways, footways, structures (bridges, retaining walls, culverts, etc.), street lighting, traffic signs, safety barriers, highway drainage, etc.

Following on from the last four years of the highly successful highways investment programme our Highways Infrastructure network will benefit from this additional funding. This investment will continue to improve and protect the fabric of the highways network and deal with the impact of winter weather conditions.

Additional works programmes for the remainder of 2015/6 and 2016/7 have been prepared based on the £1.44M of 2016/7 highways capital allocation presented in the Council's Three Year Capital Programme Report of 25th March 2015, £0.8M Earmarked Reserves and the additional £3.8M funding allocation in respect of the Council's Investment Priorities reported to Council on 28th October 2015. The allocation of this budget (£6.04M) is outlined below;

<u>Carriageways</u>: An identified programme of carriageway resurfacing and surface treatment to the value of £1.468M will be funded in 2016/7. This will be supplemented by a £0.52M allocation to carry out essential highway improvement repairs to larger areas which are identified through inspection during the course of the period.

<u>Footways</u>; are considered to be a high risk to the Council and it is proposed to allocate £0.762M in 2016/7 to repairs which have been identified by inspectors or through specialist condition surveys.

<u>Structures</u>: There are significant challenges associated with maintaining highway structures with a number of structures in a critical condition. This is compounded by high scheme costs and long scheme design / lead in periods.

The bridge expansion joints on the A472 Bridge at Fiddler's Elbow, which is jointly owned with Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council, have failed and need to be replaced as soon as possible. There are 8 very large complex joints on this structure and it is estimated that these works will cost £1.8 to £2M which will be split equally between Rhondda Cynon Taf and Merthyr. A £0.5M allocation made in the 2015/6 capital programme will be supplemented by a further £0.5M allocation. Design work is advanced with works being coordinated across programmes to ensure construction works on this structure are coincident with reduced traffic flows of the summer months of 2016 in order to minimise disruption to the highway network.

The Cilfynydd Road Wall which bounds the A470 Trunk Road has been identified as being in a very poor condition. Urgent works are ongoing at this location and an allocation of £370k will be made for the ongoing works and phase 2 of the repairs which will be implemented in 2016/7.

Gyfeillon Bridge is a life expired temporary bailey bridge structure which crosses the river to the west of the A4058 Gyfeillon Road, between Hopkinstown and Trehafod, north of Pontypridd. The proposal is to undertake preparatory works to the bridge abutments, including buttressing to the eastern abutment, before implementing an overnight road closure on the A4058 to accommodate a large crane which will be engaged with lifting out the existing bridge deck and lifting in a new purpose designed pre-fabricated bridge deck structure.

Royal Oak Bridge. Further to the approval of the Highways, Transportation and Strategic Projects – Supplementary Capital Programme by Cabinet on 16th April 2015 which allocated £210k to carry out concrete repairs to the structure, during detailed design it became apparent that the extent of works required is greater than anticipated and the scheme is likely to cost £360k. An additional £150k will be allocated to this scheme.

A WRAP Grant of £180k has been awarded to the Council to carry out strengthening works to the Glan Mychydd Fach Bridge. This grant will cover the construction costs, but the council will incur additional design / consultancy fees of £35k.

A list of the 10 highest priority structures schemes is shown below with estimated scheme costs. It must be stressed that these estimates are at a very early stage and are likely to change as further inspections, testing and design work is carried out. Advance scheme preparation work will commence on all 10 schemes in 2015/6 to refine the estimates and a further report detailing which schemes will be implemented in 2016/7 will be presented at a later date. Design work on the remaining structures will be advanced as far as possible so that future funding allocations can be based on more detailed estimates and schemes can be implemented more quickly once funding is allocated.

<u>Street Lighting</u>; An ongoing programme of column replacement to the value of £0.49M will be implemented over the remainder of 2015/6 and 2016/7. Works are targeted at the replacement of life expired concrete columns and steel columns identified as high priority through structural testing.

<u>Safety Barriers</u>: An ongoing programme of renewal of vehicle restraint barriers on the Bwlch, Rhigos and Maerdy Mountains, along with high priority damaged sections of barriers on the A road network to the value of £0.14M will be implemented over the funding period.

<u>Highway Disabled Access Improvements</u>; have in previous years been concentrated on larger scale works to improve accessibility in town centres. There is little more that can be achieved in these locations and the emphasis of the works will shift towards improvements identified and requested by disabled highway users. The programme is likely to comprise small scale works at 5 to 10 locations yet to be identified.

The proposed allocation of funding against schemes is as set out in detail appendix 1.

In summary the £6.04M of funding is allocated as follows –

- Carriageway Resurfacing Programme £1.468M
- Essential Highway Improvement repairs £0.52M
- Footways £0.762M
- Structures £2.65M
- Streetlighting £0.490M
- Safety fencing £0.14M
- Highway Disabled Access Improvements £0.01M

4.2 Transportation Infrastructure

The proposal is to provide direct funding for a range of projects to improve accessibility, reduce congestion, encourage sustainable travel and improve road safety. Additional works programmes in the areas of strategic transport improvements, traffic management, safe routes in communities and road safety for the remainder of 2015/6 and 2016/7 have been prepared based on an additional £4M of funding for these strategic projects.

Stag Square, Treorchy – proposals will be developed and, subject to consultation, a scheme will be implemented to resolve current levels of congestion by introducing innovative methods of managing congested public areas within town centres. **£0.75M**.

Safe Route to School – **Brynteg Lane, Llantrisant** – linking the communities of Llantrisant and Brynteg by providing a footway along Brynteg Lane and creating a safe route to Bryncelynnog School which responds to recent catchment changes. The scheme will further enhance active travel by providing a controlled pedestrian crossing at the B4595, immediately to the north of Llantrisant Leisure Centre. **£0.7M.**

Safe Route to School – Pedestrian Crossing – A4054 Cardiff Road (Castle Bridge) Treforest – providing a crossing to maintain a safe route between the communities of Rhydfelin and Treforest and assisting pupils attending Parc Lewis School and for pupils travelling in the opposite direction. £0.08M

Road Safety – Nant-Y-Gwyddon Junction, B4223 Nant-Y-Gwyddon Road – revisions to the layout of this complex junction to rationalise conflicting traffic movements and improve safety. **£0.165M.**

Road Safety – Hopkinstown – traffic calming and 20mph zone to improve safety in the residential streets to the north of the A4058 in the vicinity of Telelkebir Road. **£0.035M.**

Road Safety – Trallwn – traffic management measures to assist in mitigating impacts of peak hour rat –running through this community. **£0.02M.**

Road Safety – Station Road/B4595 Main Road Junction Church Village – providing pedestrian phases to the existing traffic signalised cross-roads junction to safeguard and promote pedestrian movement at this busy junction. **£0.1M.**

Strategic Network Improvement – Cynon Gateway South – Mountain Ash Cross Valley Link – develop proposals and commence land assembly to deliver the long-standing aspiration to create a cross-valley link to improve access to Mountain Ash and to relieve growing congestion on the A4059 strategic route and associated town bridge junctions. The investment will also enhance opportunities to seek third party funding. £1.95M.

Design & Feasibiity Programme - £0.2M

Funding to undertake feasibility studies and develop projects to inform future programmes and to support bids for external funding

This summarises the investment in Transport Infrastructure in the sum of $\pounds 4M$.

5 EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS

5.1 An Equality and Diversity Impact Screening has been carried out and this did not highlight potential impacts.

6 <u>CONSULTATION</u>

6.1 Consultation with relevant parties will be considered, and where deemed appropriate, undertaken on an individual scheme by scheme basis.

7 FINANCIAL IMPLICATION(S)

7.1 As outlined in Section 4 of the report, the necessary resources have been set aside to fund the proposed recommendations.

8 <u>LEGAL IMPLICATIONS OR LEGISLATION CONSIDERED</u>

8.1 This investment will assist the Council in discharging its statutory duty to maintain the Public Highway. All Procurements and Contracts intended to be let in respect of the above Schemes will need to be in accordance with current UK Legislation and EU Directives as well as complying with the Council's Contract Procedure Rules.

9 <u>LINKS TO THE COUNCIL'S CORPORATE PLAN / OTHER CORPORATE</u> <u>PRIORITIES/ Single Integrated Plan.</u>

9.1 This proposal reinforces the priorities set out in the Rhondda Cynon Taf Single Integrated Plan by maintaining/improving the highways infrastructure.

10. CONCLUSION

- 10.1 The Council is facing an unprecedented financial challenge over the next 3 years. Notwithstanding this challenge, the Council has identified an opportunity to continue to invest in our highways and transportation infrastructure.
- 10.2 The programme will support the maintenance of the Council's largest asset; the highways network, and enhance the transportation network with some key

interventions that the Council aspires to provide. Some of these have proven to be difficult to fund via third parties, grants, etc.

- 10.3 Members are requested to note that the programme is as always subject to minor changes due to possible engineering difficulties or programming and coordination issues with statutory undertakers.
- 10.4 Members are requested to note and approve the programme of Investment Priorities related to Highways and Structures and Transportation Infrastructure.
