



## **Key Question 1: Standards**

- There are no grounds for complacency.
- Improvements in performance in the primary and secondary sectors have been significant
- But the region started from a low baseline and so we have more to do to ensure that pupils can compete as successfully as they should with their peers across the UK and internationally.





## Key Question 2: School Improvement Service

- The capacity of the system to challenge and support schools to be self-improving has made significant progress over the last 18 months
- There is enhanced capacity to support schools' improvement through the sharing of effective practice
- But there is still a need to strengthen how each part of the system – schools and the service - work together to demonstrate impact, accountability and sustainability
- There is widespread support from across the system but more time is required for the processes to mature





#### **Key question 3: Leadership and Governance**

- There is agreement across the region about the role of the self-improving system as key to securing sustained improvement.
- There has been a step change in how headteachers see their role in improving outcomes and the quality of education across the system as a whole.
- The concept of system leadership is developing but there is still more work to do to involve all key stakeholders in contributing to its development.
- Good work is being done to provide evidence of impact but this remains an area for development in a climate where demonstrating value for money is a high priority.

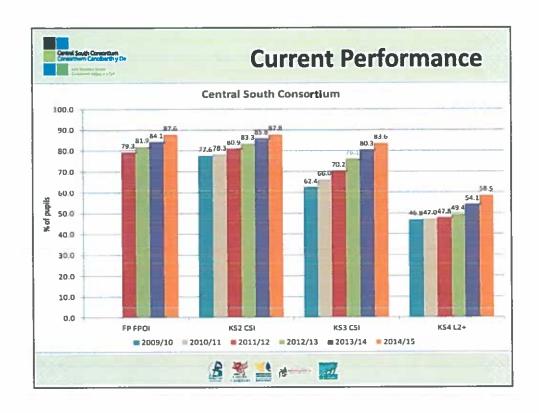


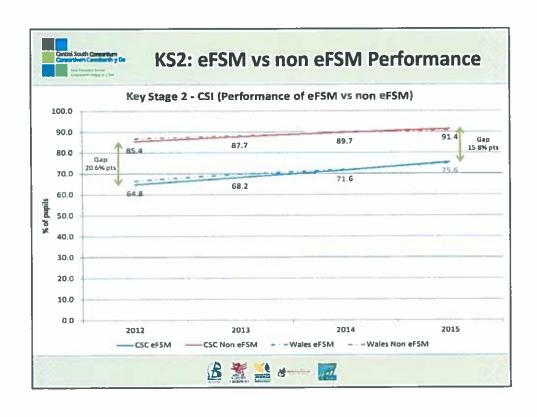


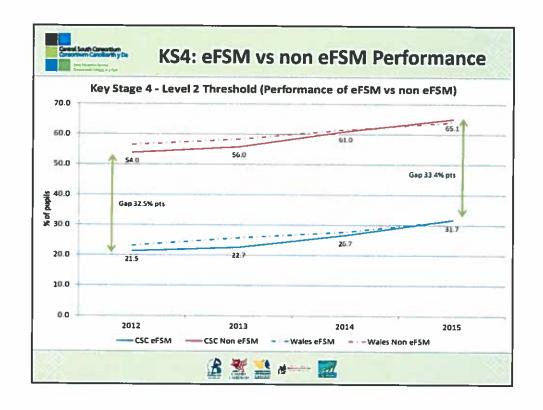
