FINANCING OF THE 21ST CENTURY SCHOOLS PROGRAMME USING PRUDENTIAL BORROWING

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek Council's approval:
 - for a capital investment of £1.956m at Cymmer Infant and Junior schools;
 and
 - to finance the refurbished school buildings through the Welsh Government's 21st Century Schools Programme (£0.978m) and from Council borrowing (£0.978m) using its powers under the Prudential Code.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that Members:

- 2.1 Agree to the inclusion in the capital programme of the major capital works at Cymmer Infants and Junior schools at a total cost of £1.956m.
- 2.2 Agree that the net cost to the Council of £0.978m is funded through borrowing, using the Council's powers under the Prudential Code, with the annual revenue cost of £0.048m being met from savings from this and other recent school closures and amalgamations.

3. BACKGROUND

3.1 Members will recall that at the meeting of Cabinet on 19th January 2016 approval was given to implement the proposal to close Cymmer Infants' and Cymmer Junior Schools and open a new Community Primary School for

Cymmer, in existing buildings that would be refurbished and remodelled for this purpose. The new school will open on 1st September 2016.

4. FINANCIAL DETAILS

- 4.1 This proposal to create one primary school for Cymmer will realise annual revenue savings of £0.156M.
- 4.2 The Welsh Government 21st Century Schools Programme will fund 50% of the total cost of £1.956m, with the Council borrowing the balance of £0.978m using the Prudential Code to fund its share of the capital expenditure cost. There would be an annual revenue cost estimated at £0.048m per year for 40 years and these costs will be funded from the revenue savings arising from closing these and other recent school closures and amalgamations.

5. **CONCLUSION**

5.1 The Council's investment in new and refurbished schools in Cymmer can be financed by Welsh Government 21st Century Schools Programme funding and the Council's use of the Prudential Code, providing first class learning environments for over 258 students.
