The Rhondda Fach Active Travel Route (the Route) is a proposed 7km shared use route between Maerdy and Pontygwaith. The 3m wide route will primarily follow the former mineral line, but will also include links to local communities and facilities such as schools and leisure centres.

Phase 3 provides a link between the Route and the community of Maerdy. Phase 3 starts adjacent to Station Road, Maerdy and links to Blake Street and the rear lane of Richard Street in Maerdy.
