I attend full Council meetings I am a member of the following Committees:

I am a Governor at Parc Lewis Primary School I am a Governor at Hawthorn High School I am Mayor of Pontypridd Town Council I am Chairman of the Treforest Regeneration Committee

Section 2: Constituency Activity

I attend monthly PACT meetings and work closely with the local Police and PCSO Officers.

I have an open door policy where constituents can call-in to my premises at Treforest. I work with the Treforest Residents Association and attend meetings with local OAP Groups at Churches.

Section 3: Initiatives and Special Activities

I worked with a Scrutiny Working Group that broadened and updated the HMO Licensing Scheme which is now concluded. This is very important and useful to Treforest due to the amount of HMO properties in the area in order to ensure that standards of HMOs are raised to required standards.

I have provided support and assistance to the Treforest Boys and Girls Club.
