To report on the evaluation of the 2013 – 2014 Individual Disabled Parking Bay Scheme.





Report on the Implementation of the individual Disabled Parking Bay Scheme

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To report on the evaluation of the 2013 -2014 scheme.
- 1.2 Following the 2013/14 evaluation to make recommendations for future Individual Disabled Parking Bay Scheme following a full and proper review to be undertaken in 2014/15. In accordance with the Council's Scheme of Delegation, this report has been prepared to accompany the intended Officer decision of the Group Director, Community and Children's Services and Group Director, Environmental Services, as described below.

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

It is recommended that:

- 2.1 The evaluation of the scheme for 2013 –2014 is noted.
- 2.2 A scheme for 2014–2015 is **suspended** to allow time for a full and proper review of the Individual Disabled Parking Bay Scheme.
- 2.3 Information on the Individual Disabled Parking Bay Scheme is updated on the Council website and replaced with information on the review of the scheme.
- 2.4 That a full and proper review of the Individual Disabled Parking Bay Scheme is undertaken in 2014/15. In order to facilitate the proposed review it is recommended that the Service Directors, Community Care and Highways, Transport and Strategic Projects, be delegated to provide a report for consideration prior to any further proposals being put forward for 2015/16.



3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 At the Cabinet meeting held on 20th July 2009, Members agreed to the outline proposals for a new scheme to administer Individual Disabled Parking Bays.
- 3.2 Since the implementation of the scheme a total of 166 parking bays have been installed across RCT. Of the bays installed, 39 have been removed, leaving 127 individual disabled parking bays on the highway.

4 EVALUATION OF 2013 - 2014 SCHEME

4.1 Overview of 2013 - 2014 Scheme

- 4.2 The initial eleven successful applicants for 2013/14 are now being taken through the formal legal process of consultation with local members and residents prior to the implementation of the bays.
- 4.3 In the past few years minor amendments have been made to the process to allow for clearer eligibility at the point of application. However the number of applications to the scheme continues to increase.
- 4.4 Following an increase in applications 125 Occupational Therapy assessments were carried out, resulting in 11 bays being awarded. The appeals process is still ongoing at the time of writing this report. Therefore there is potential for this number to increase slightly.



- 4.5 In terms of citizen expectation and Council resources, the evidence indicates over 90% of Occupational Therapy assessments undertaken result in no further action. The assessment process raises the applicant's expectations of a parking bay and leads to a disappointing outcome for the majority of applicants.
- 4.6 There is currently no information available on the impact the implementation of an individual disabled parking bay has for the individual.
- 4.7 It is proposed a full and proper review is undertaken of the Individual Parking Bay Scheme and the scheme is suspended for 2014/15 until the review is completed. As part of the evaluation of the scheme for 2013/14 an equality impact assessment has been undertaken to look at the impact of the current scheme being suspended for 2014/15 see appendix 1.
- 4.8 In order to facilitate the proposed review it is recommended that the Service Directors, Community Care and Highways, Transport and Strategic Projects, be delegated to provide a report for consideration prior to any further proposals or recommendations being put forward for 2015/16.

5 CONCLUSION

- 5.1 Applications to the scheme continue to increase year on year for individual disabled parking bays. The majority of applicants report being disappointed by both the process and the outcome. Currently there is no information available on the effectiveness for individuals where parking bays have been implemented.
- 5.2 A full and proper review and equality impact assessment of the scheme is recommended to be undertaken prior to any decisions being made for further Individual Disabled Parking Bay Scheme for 2015/16.
