COMMUNITY AND HOSPITAL INTERFACE AND DELAYED TRANSFERS OF CARE (DToC)

1. <u>PURPOSE OF THE REPORT</u>

To keep Members updated on work that is being undertaken to support the interface between community and hospital services and update Members on the numbers of people whose discharge from hospital is delayed.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

It is recommended that Members:

- 2.1 Note the work being undertaken to ensure that hospitals are able to manage the demand on their services over the winter months.
- 2.2 Note the number of delayed transfers of Care for Social Care reasons.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The ability of Local Health Boards and Councils to work together to ensure that people are discharged from hospital in a timely and safe manner continues to be seen as measure of success in developing partnership working.
- 3.2 Over the last winter the hospitals across Wales experienced exceptional demand on their services and on a number of occasions were closed to new admissions.
- 3.3 This winter pressure on the hospitals had a knock on effect into both social care and community health services.
- 3.4 Since the spring considerable work has been and is being undertaken to ensure that the difficulties the NHS experienced last winter are not repeated this winter.

4 WORK UNDERTAKEN

4.1 The First Minister early in the summer established a task and finish group to consider all issues relating to delayed transfers of care. The group has been

chaired by the Director of Social Services in Torfaen and with senior representation from the NHS and Local Government across Wales.

- 4.2 The work has involved a review of the patient experience, looking at examples from each Local Health Board of people who experienced long delays in being discharged to care home accommodation. A review of the choice procedure, work on 'front door services', definitions and measures and different models of care.
- 4.3 The group is due to report shortly with an expectation that its recommendations will be acted on immediately.
- 4.4 Local Health Boards and Local Authorities have also been required to prepare and submit plans to Welsh Government on how they will better manage winter pressures this year. These unscheduled care plans have been scrutinised by Welsh Government who have planned a serious of seminars to share learning and ideas and hold organisations to account.
- 4.5 We have agreed and submitted a plan with Merthyr and Cwm Taf some of the elements of which include:
 - An ability to manage increased demand by opening additional bed capacity
 - A more proactive approach from senior managers to ensuring timely discharge and ensuring the choice procedure is adhered to.
 - Making use of a small number of residential care beds to facilitate faster discharge home or prevent admission to hospital.
 - Continuing to make best use of community resources such as district nursing, intermediate care and reablement services.
- 4.6 The LHB and Council will also be considering other measures that may assist, such as jointly funding some "interim care home placements" where people's first choice of home is not immediately available.

5.0 DELAYED TRANSFER OF CARE

- 5.1 The work identified above will improve the flow of patients through hospital, inevitably though there will continue to be a very small number of people who remain in hospital longer than they need to. One of the national workstreams identified above has been looking at whether DToC figures are helpful in managing and addressing this issue and will form part of their report.
