Finding out what services work well in RCT, what services need improving and what needs there are for future services.

 Information workshop to inform the forum about creative activities and groups in RCT. To find out from young people what art services would they like to see in the future and how would they like to access these.

 workshop discussions.

 Workshop around local NHS services, what works well, what should be improved and what needs to change. Workshop influenced by Cwm Taf Health Borad Survey and carried out by Voices From Care.

 Part of an Erasmus project. A residential in Glan Llyn, North Wales for young people to come together from across Wales to talk about developing resources and attending a national conference on corporate parenting, and to share their experiences and their voice around what does corporate parenting look like and their needs as young people, along with their involvement in co-production.
- Erasmus over 18's residential
 Part of an Erasmus project. A residential in Llangrannog, Mid Wales for young people to come together from across Wales to talk about developing resources and attending a national conference on corporate parenting, and to share their experiences and their voice around what does corporate parenting look like and their needs as young people, along with their involvement in co-production.

<u>April</u>

Blueprint attended the regional looked after group for children & young people who are, or have been in care from Cardiff, The Vale, Merthyr & RCT.
 Young people fed into a published online guide created with Children in Wales around health assessments for young people.

- Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama taster session in Pembrokeshire. Introductory session for young people into the arts.
- Street Football Wales Women's Cup
 <u>Girls from Blueprint took part in the Women's Cup with Street Football Wales in Newport.</u> <u>This was the first time girls from the forum engaged with other girls from Wales in a football activity. From this they participated in the cup and came 2nd in the entire <u>competition.</u>

 Young person from Blueprint attended the renowned Hay Festival event in Hay on Wye.
 This Festival is to inspire children, young people and adults into the world of literacy and the arts.
- Alfie's Army ½ Marathon meeting about the run Meeting with young people to engage them in the running opportunity.

<u>June</u>

- National Assembly Youth Parliament Consultation
 Young people had the opportunity to have an active say and input into the youth parliament in Wales for young people. The NAFW attended Blueprint to raise awareness of the opportunity for young people and to take young people's voices on board about the parliament.
- 5N1V Scotland Summer Camp Meeting Young person from Blueprint attended a meeting in Cardiff for the Summer Camp to cover aspects of what the Camp involves.

<u>July</u>

- 5N1V Scotland Summer Camp Young person from Blueprint attended the Summer Camp with young people from Wales as representatives at the Camp. The Camp is a fun initiative for care experienced young people across the Nations; this year young people got involved with the 1,000 campaign in Scotland with Nicola Sturgeon.

 <u>Opportunity for young people to attend the Cardiff initiative to encourage young people to</u> <u>explore higher education in Wales. This involved a smaller scale graduation for attending</u> <u>the activity.</u>

 Hosting at the Wales Millennium Centre, the forum attended a regional event facilitated by
 Voices From Care to highlight the voice of young people in Cardiff, The Vale, Merthyr and

- 5k Cardiff Park run for Alfie's Army <u>Training for the Cardiff half marathon with Gareth Thomas.</u>
- Pontypridd run for Alfie's Army <u>Training for the Cardiff half marathon.</u>
- X2 Pontypridd run for Alfie's Army <u>Training for the Cardiff half marathon.</u>

September

 <u>A consultation brought to the forum to find out what works within the care system and what needs improving.</u>
- Challenge Wales Activity
 <u>Opportunity for young people to experience a sailing voyage to the Bristol Channel to</u> <u>Cardiff while achieving a Entry Level 3 TeamWork qualification.</u>
- 5N1V Residential in Wales <u>Opportunity for young people to be involved on a national level around care experiences</u> <u>across the UK.</u>
- 10k Cardiff for Alfie's Army <u>Training for the Cardiff half marathon with Gareth Thomas and Jamie Baulch.</u>
- Pontypridd run for Alfie's Army <u>Training for the Cardiff half marathon.</u>

What's happened / coming up in October?

- Alfie's Army Half Marathon <u>4 young people from RCT and voices from care participated in the BBC Aflie's Army ½</u> <u>marathon run and all completed the race successfully.</u>
- Children in Wales Transition into independence

Forum sessions with Children in Wales around creating a online published guide for young people across Wales around things that are important to young people. The forum will be responsible for developing and creating these guides.

- RCT Mayor's Parlour award ceremony
 Event for young people who completed the Alfie's Army ½ marathon run with Voices From
 Care. Representatives will be attending from RCT to congratulate the young people along
 with the Mayor to recognise their achievements.
- NYAS Employability Workshop
- <u>A workshop with NYAS around employability and the opportunities there are for young people. To highlight NYAS and what their service offers for young people, to inform young people what other services are available.</u>

Initiatives for the Next 6 Months

- To build relationships with those who have Corporate Parenting responsibilities in RCT; particularly with departments and bodies that sit outside of social services. The aim of this is to offer insight, advice and guidance on how to support looked after children and care leavers.
- To continue to build the relationship between the Corporate Parenting Panel and The Blueprint Forum. For young people from the Forum to be more actively involved in Corporate Parenting Board Meetings as representatives.
- Working with RCT's 16+ team to scope the development of a 'drop in service' for care leavers at the Old Barnardo's Centre. Voices From Care currently utilise the building for the Blueprint forum sessions.
- The group will be publishing their third newsletter, with assistance from RCT's press and promotions team. Additionally the group are keen on improving the engagement of young people in the newsletters content through competitions.
- To draft a 'work plan' for Blueprint forum for the year 2018 with RCT and young people.
- The group to work more collaboratively with RCT on the RCT two sides website.
- Continuing to build link to teams, project and schemes within RCT such as 'Inspire 2 Work'.
- To engage with more young people, particularly those aged 14-16.
