| Projects Themes | The RCT forum played a key role in developing a series on information guides for care experienced young people across Wales. These resources: developed by Children in Wales, provide young people advice on sibling contact, benefit entitlements and online safety for care experienced young people. | | Peer Mentor Training State of Mind is a project delivered by Platfform that helps young people develop everyday wellbeing strategies, whilst talking about mental health and learning new skills. As part of the programme the young people where trained as peer mentors to pass | |

| | on their own learning and support to other young people in their own community. In the next year, we aim to support the group to deliver self-care group sessions to the care experienced community throughout RCT. | |
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| | Creative writing | |
| | VFCC and partnered up with Write 4 Word, to deliver creative writing and poetry sessions with the young people, focussing on creative writing to promote positive mental health. Sessions continue to be delivered via virtual means, whilst we remain under lockdown during COVID-19. | |
| | Project Evaluation; | |
| | During the last year the local group was evaluated by the young people. Their feedback has now been implemented as part of the Local Group Development Officer's action plan for the Local Group moving forward. | |
| Project Sucesses | Former group members employed at Voices From Care Cymru In the last year, VFCC have employed two (2) new members of staff who were previous members of the RCT Local Group and participated in the Care 2 Work scheme. One of those members of staff becoming the new Local Group Development Officer, running The RCT Forum. | |
| | Building Connections with RCT schools Work has started with Tonyrefial Comprehensive school to consult with a younger age demographic within the local authority. This includes delivering consultation sessions on their experiences and ambitions for the care system in RCT. This work will continue throughout the next financial year, to increase the number of young people we engage with throughout the authority via the local groups. | |
| | Presenting to corporate parents from across Wales The group also led on presenting to corporate parents across Wales the findings from 'Listen, Act, Thrive', a consultation report on the mental health of care experienced young people. Young people from RCT where involved in the consultation and project design during the year 2018/19. | |
