"This Council recognises the serious dangers posed by Sepsis, which claims the lives of 44,000 people in the UK every year.

Known as the 'silent killer', it is the leading cause of avoidable death in the UK and occurs when the body violently responds to an infection by attacking its own organs.

The Council recognises the steps taken by the Welsh Government in becoming the first country in the World to introduce a system of early escalation of deteriorating patients, and the work done through the 1,000 Lives Programme which raises awareness of Sepsis within the NHS.

Also acknowledges the need to increase awareness amongst the public, particularly in light of the often seemingly flu-like symptoms.

This Council therefore RESOLVES to:

Support the call for the Welsh Government to undertake a Sepsis Public Awareness Campaign to improve outcomes for survivors and those affected.

Take steps to promote education and awareness of the symptoms of Sepsis across the County Borough including the Council's staff network".

The Council applauds the significant efforts of the Rhondda Tunnel Society and also those involved in the campaign to reopen the Abernant Tunnel.

Members will note the huge success of the Two Tunnels Greenway project in Bath, which attracts thousands of visitors every year and recently held the annual Two Tunnels half marathon races.

The re-opening of both tunnels could act as a major catalyst for improving Active Travel, leisure and tourism opportunities across the County Borough and therefore aligns with this Council's commitment to creating a healthy and active RCT.

This Council therefore RESOLVES to:

- Support the campaigns to re-open both of the tunnels in recognition of the huge potential they hold for improving tourism and Active Travel, and also for improving the local economy.
- Continues to liaise with the Welsh Government and the relevant neighbouring local authorities, namely Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council and Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council to realise the ambitions of both of these projects".
