1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

The purpose of the report is to update Members on relevant issues, with regard to

3. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that a quarterly meeting is convened to review and discuss the implementation and progress of the Licensing Act 2003, together with any ancillary matters arising from responsibilities with which this particular Committee is charged.

Such ancillary matters include the Gambling Act 2005. (There may also be ancillary matters arising from the impact of the Smoke-Free Premises Regulations, which have the potential to affect all licensed premises).

4. LICENSING ACT 2003

4.1 Application Process

The downward trend for TEN's appear to be continuing and this possibly reflects the flexibility afforded to licensed premises by the implementation of the Live Music Act. An analysis of applications confirms an almost equal allocation between Club Premises Certificates, Premises Licences and community initiatives. There continue to be no adverse impact from the process and this is potentially the driver for change, where Government have a proposal to extend the provisions for authorisation of licensable activity with TENs. The proposal is currently the subject of consultation and further information will be provided when proposals are confirmed.

(i) Penygraig RFC

The Review of the Club Premises Certificate was initiated by the Licensing Authority, acting in its capacity as a Responsible Authority and is a good example of the effective utilisation of this role. There appeared to be areas of ineffective management control, which was insufficient for respective Responsible Authorities to call Review. However, the collective picture presented as a result of monitoring of the premises 1/2/13 gave rise to more serious concerns.

Potential sales of alcohol to under age persons were identified, along with audible music noise and the locking of emergency exists. This activity was associated with a young person's party, agreed with an officer of the Club, but without the appropriate TEN authorisation.

This activity was of particular concern as Licensing Officers & partner agencies had visited the premises on several occasions for the purpose of advice & guidance.

Following the service of the Review, the management committee responded to the concerns of the Licensing Authority with a restructure and appointment of alternative officers to key posts. The Responsible Authorities welcomed this approach, which effectively improved confidence in management. This was reinforced by the mediation meeting held 30th April 2013 which demonstrated changes made to the management regime.

The positive response of the management committee allowed the Licensing Authority to have regard to the 'light touch regulation' advocated for such premises, which are essentially run on a 'not for profit basis'. However, premises must still be operated in accordance with the law and the management committee must recognise their role in protecting their patrons and the community in which they trade.

In recognition of the improved confidence in management and revised management arrangements Members determined that the Club Premises Certificate be allowed to continue with imposition of conditions and a warning re future activity.

(ii) Rhydfelin Convenience Store

The premises is a small convenience store with a premises Licence which permits sale of alcohol for 'off sale' only. Premises inspection identified an absent licensee & DPS and this indicated an absence of appropriate control which was reflected in complaints received regarding potential sale of alcohol to under age persons.

The service of the review initiated a change in a management control and improved confidence in the business to continue to trade. The existing conditions of licence were poorly expressed and the opportunity was taken to impose more robust controls that were both clear and unambiguous.

The owner of the business appreciated the early intervention and advice given and was happy to accept the imposition of conditions as proposed. Consequently the matter was dealt with administratively, with the agreement of the Sub Committee.

This is a further good example of the use of the Review process as an early intervention strategy, which is consistent with the ethos of the licensing objectives to engage compliance and prevent illegal activity in the interest of both the business and the community.

(i) Morgan Tavern

Members will recall the report of the 16th April 2013 where the revocation of the Premises Licence was reported. A copy of an extract of the report is reproduced for information as **Appendix 1B.**

The appeal was determined over a protracted period of 4 days, where the District Judge had the opportunity to consider all the information that was presented to the Licensing Committee, together with new information arising in the intervening period.

The basis of the defence of the appeal was that the decision was 'wrong, disproportionate & draconian' and that the Sub Committee had failed to take account of all options open to them, including suspension of the licence as a mechanism to secure continued trading. In addition representation was made that there had been a significant improvement in the management of the premises since service of the Review.

The Licensing Authority responded with a position that all options had received due consideration but the lack of confidence in management was such that no measure other than revocation could secure the promotion of the licensing objectives.

In addition, Officers reported additional matters of concern, arising in the intervening period between the date of the decision to revoke and the appeal hearing. This included primarily low level issues, such as demonstrated non-compliance with conditions of licence; complaints re inappropriate activity and Police incident reports. CCTV was also utilised to demonstrate that issues of concern identified during the review process were continuing to occur at the premises, despite assurances from the premises manager that such matters were now addressed. The collective position presented demonstrated that the management regime continued to be ineffective.

In his summation, The District Judge recognised the improvement in management since the service of the review. However he expressed a view that it was vitally important that such a premise was subject to robust management control where compliance with licensing conditions was paramount. Reference was made to the non-compliance identified by the Licensing Authority when the premises was under scrutiny and the District Judge concluded that the appellant had failed to demonstrate that the decision of the Licensing Committee was wrong, or disproportionate and accordingly dismissed the appeal, awarding costs of £4370 to the Licensing Authority.

The premises were subject to immediate closure as at 25th September 2013.

The closure of the premises in a high profile location in Pontypridd Town centre is a cause of concern to the Licensing Authority and partner agencies. South Wales Police, as witnesses for the Licensing Authority sought to assure the parties that closure of the premises was not the desired outcome. However the adverse impact of the trading position on the community was undermining the licensing objectives and presenting a risk that was unacceptable.

4.5 Compliance & Enforcement

(i) Prosecutions

There are no prosecutions to report for the period.

(ii) Test Purchasing

10 Test Purchases for sale of alcohol to under age persons were undertaken in the period. This resulted in 2 sales; one sale was directly responsible for initiating a Review of Premises Licence as a result of concerns regarding management control.

One sale was made at an automated check out at a convenience store and this is currently the subject of legal advice in respect of person responsible for sale.

(v) Premises Inspection & Infringements

31 premises have been inspected during the last period, the full inspection regime being temporarily suspended as a result on the ongoing staffing issues in the Licensing Team.

As indicated previously, resources will be allocated to ensure WPI targets are met and it is anticipated that any backlog created will be cleared before the end of the year.

A summary of infringements identified is reproduced for information as **Appendix 1D.**

4.6 Legislative Change

Personal Alcohol Licences

The Government are currently consulting on proposals to review the regime for the issue of Personal Licences.

Licences are currently issued for 10 year period, with a significant number due for renewal in November 2015, following the introduction of the regime in 2005.

The renewal process will have a significant impact on resources for Local Authorities, but the basis of the changes is to limit unnecessary bureaucracy whilst maintaining adequate control of alcohol sales. Consideration is being given to the imposition of conditions applied locally to Premises Licence as a more cost effective, targeted alternative.

A summary of the key proposals are reproduced for information as **Appendix 1E.**

Further information will be provided following the outcome of the consultation period.

5.2 Trade profile – Gaming Permits

Complimentary to Premises Licences are a wide range of Gambling Permits that allow lower level gaming in primarily alcohol licensed premises.

No Gaming Permits have been processed in the last assessment period.

5.3 Enforcement

The Licensing Authority was invited to assist the Gambling Commission in a trial of test purchases in respect of local gambling premises. The product to be tested was Fixed Odds Betting Terminals (FOBT) which facilitates gambling remotely without direct interaction with a member of staff, (but under their supervision).

The process was intelligence led and four premises were tested. Tests were undertaken by Trading Standards Officers using volunteers in a similar manner to alcohol test purchases.

All four premises tested failed in that use of the FOBT was made by the volunteer.

Advice & guidance was given to each operator with a warning in respect of future activity. This action was initiated at the request of the Gambling Commission as it is their intention to launch a publicity campaign to raise awareness with licensees in respect of protection of young persons and test purchase regimes.

6 Recovery of Annual Fees

As a result of the static nature of the trade, there is little change to the position, where 100% recovery of annual fees is the standard, primarily due to the robust provisions contained within the legislation which allow for withdrawal of the licence/permit for non-payment of appropriate fees.

(i) Morgan Tavern

The review was called by South Wales Police as a result of escalating levels of crime & disorder associated with the premises. This was evidenced by means of Police incident records and reflected in the Police 'Traffic Light' Analysis, where the premises was deemed as the worst performing in the Police area.

The concerns were exacerbated by a lack of confidence in management, in that this was the second review of the premises and whilst the previous review had achieved an improvement this had not been sustained.

There was also evidence of non-compliance with current conditions of licence, which had been imposed at review specifically to improve management practice and control in recognition of previous problems.

The Police expressed a view that whilst the licensee sought to co-operate with the Responsible Authorities on most occasions, there was an increasing need for intervention from various agencies in order to maintain an acceptable level of control. This suggested that the management capacity at the premises was inappropriate.

There was a collective concern from Responsible Authorities that current failures in management practices were giving rise to non-compliance with conditions and a compromising of the licensing objectives.

Responsible Authorities were in agreement that there was little merit in imposing conditions to achieve improvement as there was no confidence in management to achieve sustained compliance.

In view of the foregoing, and having regard to the previous review of licence, warnings issued to secure improvement and the level of recent interventions Members resolved that the licence be revoked.

The Licensee subsequently appealed the decision and a court date is currently awaited.

Pub dubbed 'worst in borough' for crime and disorder has lost its alcohol licence

Pontypridd pub has its alcohol licence taken away following a 'catalogue' of problems including violence, under-age drinking and drinking after hours





A Pontypridd pub dubbed "the worst in the county borough" for crime and disorder has lost its licence to sell alcohol.

Morgan Tavern, on High Street, had its licence revoked this week following a "catalogue" of problems with crime and disorder.

South Wales Police and Rhondda Cynon Taf council said the popular watering hole failed to protect public safety, prevent public nuisance and protect children from harm In a hearing by Rhondda Cynon Taf Council's Licensing Committee, Trading Standards and South Wales Police produced a damning report which claimed sufficient evidence was found to warrant the pub losing its licence.

The report slated management for their "lack of social responsibility" to assist police with the investigation of offences.

Staff were also accused of failing to stick to designated closure times and maintain training for staff in respect of selling age-restricted products.

Concern about the over-capacity of the building and its high levels of underage drinkers were also called into question.

South Wales Police officers often "plant" young people in pubs to test staff on their identity checks.

But given the extent of the problems at Morgan Tavern, the authority decided not to carry out such an operation at the pub - for fear of putting the young person in danger. Its licence was previously revoked in 2009, but officers said little had changed during the three-year period despite a raft of measures to address the issues.

The manager of the pub, who appeared at the hearing at Pontypridd Magistrates' Court, said he was not present on weekends and relied on his staff to keep him informed of incidents. He also claimed CCTV footage was available. South Wales Police, who use a "traffic light system" to indicate levels of crime and disorder, said Morgan Tavern as the only premises in Rhondda Cynon Taff to have a consistent "red level.

The licensee was order to pay costs of £4,370 after an unsuccessful appeal.

Head of Community Protection at Rhondda Cynon Taf Council, David Jones said: "A catalogue of drunken, violent and antisocial behaviour by patrons, shows that the management of the Morgan Tavern have once again blatantly disregarded their responsibilities, the law and the conditions of their licence.

"Under these circumstances revocation of the license was the only realistic option open to the Licensing Committee.

Inspector, Nigel Griffiths of South Wales Police said: "We've worked closely with this establishment for a number of years, but it has been unable to mend its ways. "Violence and anti social behaviour, which would often spill out onto the streets outside, have continued to be linked to the pub and in the end we were left with no other alternative but to apply to stop it from trading."

6. Annex A - Proposal Summary

Our proposal to abolish personal licences would cut unnecessary bureaucracy for businesses while maintaining key safeguards to tackle irresponsible premises. As well as abolishing personal licences, we would maintain, or even strengthen, existing legislation in several ways. We would:

- i. Amend the mandatory conditions to require all alcohol sales to be authorised by the DPS, rather than a personal licence holder;
- ii. Allow the police to object under s.37 of the 2003 Act to a new DPS based on the crime prevention objective in general, rather than only in 'exceptional circumstances';
- iii. Allow licensing authorities to require a criminal records declaration with each new change of a DPS; and
- iv. Allow those who either are named as the DPS on a premises licence or have accredited training to give up to 50 Temporary Event Notices (TENs) a year; those without would be limited to giving only five.
