1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

The purpose of the report is to update Members on relevant issues, with regard to

- the Licensing Act 2003
- the Gambling Act 2005

3. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that a quarterly meeting is convened to review and discuss the implementation and progress of the Licensing Act 2003, together with any ancillary matters arising from responsibilities with which this particular Committee is charged.

Such ancillary matters include the Gambling Act 2005. (There may also be ancillary matters arising from the impact of the Smoke-Free Premises Regulations, which have the potential to affect all licensed premises).

4. LICENSING ACT 2003

4.1 Application Process

Summary of TEN's, reproduced as Appendix 1A.

Analysis of figures indicates 22 for Members Clubs; 10 for Community events and 20 for existing Premises Licences, however 8 of these were to facilitate trading whilst a Premises Application was pending (ie Boars Head, Llwyncelyn Hotel and The Osbborne Hotel). There continues to be no adverse impact from such applications.

In accordance with the advice received in respect of data protection matters, the summaries of Personal Licences and Premises Licences issued under delegated authority are now reproduced for information as a Part II restricted item.

Fagin's Ale & Chop House

This review was called by the EHO as a result of a continuing statutory nuisance arising from live music held at the premises. The EHO had responded to the nuisance by the service of an Abatement Notice in accordance with powers under the Environmental Protection Act 1980. However this did not achieve a resolution of the problem; complaints continued to be received and several breaches of the Abatement Notice were witnessed.

Whilst prosecution of the relevant person was an option under consideration, it was not pursued as a result of mitigating circumstances, consistent with the enforcement concordat. However, it was clearly not in the public interest to allow continued breaches to occur.

Monitoring confirmed that the complaints were linked to live music events on certain evenings, where such activity was permitted by the Live Music Act 2012.

The purpose of the review was to remove the exemption afforded to the premises by the Live Music Act, until such time that the licensee could demonstrate compliance with the Abatement Notice.

Whilst there had been considerable liaison with the licensee during the process, it is likely that the seriousness of the position did not become apparent until faced with the prospect of the loss of the live music facility and the significant detrimental impact this would have on the business.

The licensee had trialled several methods to mitigate the music noise and whilst considerable expense had been incurred, a solution had not been achieved.

During the course of the hearing, an alternative way forward was identified, where the exemption was removed, but the live music activity allowed to continue, subject to a condition of licence requiring 'nil audibility' in neighbouring premises.

It is pleasing to note that at the time of preparing this report, there have been no further complaints in respect of audible music noise – and the premises continues to hold its very popular music nights, but with a different style of music.

Best One Superstore

Members will be aware that the lodging of an application for appeal effectively 'stays' the impact of any decision by the Licensing Committee, subject to that appeal being determined or withdrawn. The review application in respect of this premise was determined 18/12/13 and trading over the busy Christmas period would have been secured by the statutory 21day right of appeal, then further extended by the lodging of the formal appeal.

Licensing Officers duly prepared for the impending Court case, but it did not proceed following a change of legal advisor to the appellant and the subsequent withdrawal of the appeal. Whilst it is open to the Licensing Authority to seek costs where the appellant is seen to behave unreasonably, in the particular circumstances this was not deemed to be the case and no costs were sought.

The appellants subsequently attended training to secure the accredited qualification required, (at their own cost) and also made changes to the management regime to satisfy Responsible Authority concerns.

4.5 Compliance & Enforcement

(i) Prosecutions

There are no prosecutions concluded for this period.

(iii) Test Purchasing

30 test purchases were carried out during the period, with one sale being made at premises in Aberdare on 24th February 2014. DPS & Premises Licence Holder have been interviewed and investigation is ongoing

8 proxy sale operations were carried out, based on intelligence received. Seizure of alcohol from under age persons was made but majority of proxy sales were not witnessed. 1 proxy sale witnessed from premise in Pontypridd on 21st March 2014, where a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) was issued and it was established that alcohol was intended for 14 and 15 year olds, clearly an unsatisfactory situation.

Business advice in relation to underage sales was provided to 56 businesses during the period detailed.

An example of the manner in which advice & guidance is disseminated in the wider community is the attendance of an Officer at St John's Baptist School in Aberdare on 13th January 2014. The visit followed a request to give a talk to a class on underage sales, in particular in respect of alcohol. There were 13 children present, aged 14 and 15 and the session consisted of an explanation of the legislation, practicalities of test purchasing, a video and a short quiz. The interest of the children

was demonstrated by the numerous questions asked which covered a wide range of age restricted products, including alcohol. Whilst the role of Trading Standards is primarily viewed as 'enforcement' it is pleasing to note the diversification and the contribution it can make to raising awareness on age restricted products.

Trading Standards Officers participated in the licensee training initiative on an advisory basis and provided guidance in respect of age restricted products and retail sale, again an example of their 'preventative' role.

Whilst it is pleasing to note that successful test purchases are continuing to be low, it is considered necessary to maintain the intervention to ensure that this position is maintained. The test purchase regime is just one of the tools used by Trading Standards Officers to promote control of age restricted products and their participation in the licensee training initiative was particularly welcomed in that it gave a further opportunity of engaging with licensees in a positive environment.

(iv) Premises Inspection & Infringements

68 premises were inspected in the last period, albeit the full inspection programme has yet to be resumed as a result of resource dedicated to the licensee training initiative.

At the time of preparing this report (at the end of the administrative year) there are approximately 253 premises outstanding, primarily low risk premises but including those that are 'zero rated' as a result of a change in management/ownership.

The full inspection programme will be reinstated, subject to the return of an Officer currently on maternity leave. However, inspections will be prioritised to ensure that WPI targets continue to be met.

A summary of infringements is reproduced for information as **Appendix 1B**

It is pleasing to note that majority of infringements are relatively minor administrative matters, that can be promptly resolved. It is noted that there were however several of concern, namely an absent Personal Licence Holder and dysfunctional CCTV.

(v) Licensee Training

As a result of several recent Premise Licences Reviews, it has become apparent that certain licensees may be operating at a disadvantage by virtue of the granting of Personal Licences under 'Grandfather Rights'. Such licensees were afforded the opportunity for the granting of their licences without the need to attain the BIIAB Award for Personal

Licensees and consequently no training in respect of the Licensing Act 2003 was undertaken.

Whilst many licensees have previous experience, the absence of training appears to have contributed to non-compliance and adverse impact to communities, particularly in respect of control of age restricted products (alcohol).

Having identified the lack of awareness of the legislation as a contributory factor, it was decided to target such persons with a view to delivering the formal training that had been missed.

The training was funded by monies made available via Welsh Assembly Government to support responsible alcohol retailing. This was considered to be an appropriate use of resource to support the licensed trade, promoting viable business and protecting our communities.

In conjunction with partner agencies, a pool of candidates was identified, which included the managers/DPS of certain premises where Officers considered that confidence in management would be improved with the provision of further accredited training.

Given the funding available, it was decided to offer 30 places for the training of licensees who held their licences under 'Grandfather Rights' and 15 places for the managers/DPS to attain the Level 2 qualification. Training was provided by Access Training Ltd, an accredited training provider.

The response from licensees to the letter of invite was initially slow. However, acceptance of the training opportunity increased significantly as a result of follow up telephone calls by Licensing Officers. This was a good example of the positive outcome of the premises inspection visits, where licensees had established a good relationship with Officers and were more prepared to make the commitment following a personal approach. Generally, reluctance to attend was the 'fear factor' associated with a formal examination and Officers needed to give advice & reassurance to persons who may not have been involved in an academic environment for some time.

Pass rate was excellent (95%), with only 3 failures out of 61 candidates. Response of candidates to initiative was very positive where the value of the training and contribution to their business was recognised.

Some delegate comments from feedback sheets are reproduced below for information:

When asked, how the learning will be implemented within your job role?

Delegates commented:

- More understanding of what the problems that could arise in the retail trade
- It has refreshed my knowledge of what it entails to be a personal Licence Holder and brought me up to date with new legislation
- To train staff
- More awareness & good practice for future
- Will share what I have learned with my staff
- We can implement correct procedures for future inspections
- I have learned things have changed over the last 17 years!

One delegate, having been impressed by the potential impact to his business responded by booking, (at his own expense), a course for 20 of his staff to attain the Level 1 Award in Responsible Alcohol Retailing for Bar Staff.

This serves to demonstrate the value of the investment made to raise standards, linking professional performance to commercial viability.

A summary of the courses / delegates is reproduced for information as **Appendix 1C**

Best Bar None

At the time of preparing this report, preparations are being made to roll out Best Bar None 2014.

The format of the award scheme is likely to change for this year, in recognition of the need to maintain its local flavour and also mindful of the current economic climate.

Best Bar None continues to be recognised as best practice and is a nationally recognised mechanism to support the licensed trade who make a valuable contribution to our communities.

Further update on the scheme for 2014 will be provided at the next meeting.

4.5 Legislative Update

(i) Retention of Personal Licences

On Monday 24/3/14 the Home Office announced that the plans to abolish the system of Personal Licences had been scrapped.

The recent consultation 'Personal Licences: Enabling Targeted Local Alternatives' had set out a proposal to replace the current regime and allow Licensing Authorities to develop their own initiatives to meet local objectives.

The response to the consultation indicated that 90% of respondents did not support the idea, and considered that to do so would undermine the licensing objectives. There was a consensus that the current system ensured a minimum standard of training, albeit there was a view that the current system could be improved.

The proposal was part of the Government's 'deregulation initiative' but it was noted that even the licensed trade did not support the proposal expressing a view that it was likely to lead to inconsistency between Licensing Authorities with additional burdens to both parties.

There are currently no proposals to take on board any of the suggested changes to improve the current system, although the Government have given a commitment to "strike a balance between removing unnecessary bureaucracy for responsible businesses but maintaining important safeguards".

In this context it is understood that a Deregulation Bill will make provision that Personal Licences, (currently with a life of 10 years) will not need to be renewed. This will have a significant impact on Licensing Authorities who would be facing the prospect of a significant number of renewals in 2015 as a result of the implementation of the Licensing Act in 2005.

Further information will be provided in this respect as it is available.

At the time of preparing this report there are **currently 1386 Personal Licences** in force in Rhondda Cynon Taf.

The key criticism of the current regime is that power of suspension & revocation rests with Magistrates Courts and not the Licensing Authority. The majority of Licensing Authorities report that action against such licences is minimal and many express the view that given the success of Councils in managing Premises Licences, consideration should be given to transferring powers to the Licensing Authorities. However, the additional burden in this current economic climate is clearly a matter that will require careful consideration.

(ii) Banning Sale of Alcohol below 'cost of duty' plus VAT

Whilst proposals to implement a minimum pricing policy for alcohol have currently been withdrawn, it has been replaced by the implementation of a MANDATORY CONDITION which provides that alcohol is not sold/supplied from licensed premises at a price below the **permitted price**.

Permitted Price is defined as:

'the aggregate of the duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol on the date of its sale or supply and the amount of that duty multiplied by a percentage which represents the rate of VAT chargeable in relation to the alcohol on the date of its sale or supply'.

Guidance to Licensing Authorities was issued 1/4/14 with the proposal that it take effect from 6/4/14.

The purpose is to prevent businesses from selling alcohol at heavily discounted prices and aims to reduce excessive alcohol consumption and its associated impact on alcohol related crime & health harms.

The new condition will apply to all licensed premises in England & Wales, including those with Club Premises Certificates.

The provisions will be enforced by Local Authorities including Licensing Authorities, Trading Standards and Police. Guidance has been provided for enforcement officers with a recommendation that only prices of heavily discounted alcohol should be checked.

It is clearly intended to act as a preventative mechanism and reduce availability of cheap alcohol, albeit the complexity of the calculations required to determine 'permitted price' is likely to be a challenge for both licensed trade and enforcement officers.
