# REPORT OF THE SERVICE DIRECTOR, PUBLIC HEALTH & PROTECTION

# 19. REVIEW OF THE LICENSING ACT 2003 AND THE GAMBLING ACT 2005

The Service Director, Public Health & Protection presented the Committee with his quarterly report on relevant issues with regard to the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005, together with ancillary matters arising from the responsibilities charged to the Committee.

The high number of TEN's for the period was attributed to the additional seasonal events held at this time. Updates were provided in respect of the one contested application, two reviews and three appeals with outcomes attributed to each one for information.

The Service Director, Public Health & Protection provided information in respect of the team's compliance and enforcement activity for the period including the number of test purchases undertaken, premises inspections and infringements and details of those annual fees which have been successfully recovered.

The Service Director, Public Health & Protection advised Committee that the Gambling Licensing Policy Review 2016-2018, which had been commended for re adoption by this Committee on the 20<sup>th</sup> October 2015, had been formally approved by both Full Council on the 25<sup>th</sup> November 2015 and Cabinet on the 24<sup>th</sup> November 2015. Committee noted that the revised policy would be adopted for implementation in January 2016.

There followed a series of questions posed by members of the Committee in respect of the process of recovering annual fees and of the premises inspections and infringements which were duly answered by the Service Director Public Health & Protection.

Following consideration of the report it was **RESOLVED**:-
