1. APOLOGY

An apology of absence was received from County Borough Councillors S. A. Bradwick, K. Montague, I. Pearce, L. Walker, E. Webster, C. J. Williams, T. Williams and W. D. Weeks

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

In accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct County Borough Councillor A. S. Fox declared a personal interest in relation to Item No. 4, Temporary Events Notice Reference 421692 – 'Part of the organising Committee. Gave advice as local Member.'

3. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1988 AND CRIME & DISORDER ACT

RESOLVED to note, that when Members determine the licensing and registration matters before them they have a duty not to act in a manner that is incompatible with the convention on Human Rights and the Crime and Disorder Act.

4. MINUTES

RESOLVED to approve as an accurate record the minutes of the meeting of the Licensing Committee (sitting in its role under the Licensing Act 2003) held on the 12th April 2016.

REPORT OF THE SERVICE DIRECTOR, PUBLIC HEALTH & PROTECTION

5. REVIEW OF THE LICENSING ACT 2003 AND THE GAMBLING ACT 2005

The Service Director, Public Health & Protection presented the Committee with his quarterly report on relevant issues with regard to the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005, together with ancillary matters arising from the responsibilities charged to the Committee.

Members of the Committee were informed that the large number of Temporary Events Notices before Members was not unusual for the time of year as the period included two Bank Holidays.

The Service Director Public Health & Protection updated committee with details of the four contested applications, one review application and one appeal which had taken place since the last report. More detailed information was provided in relation to the appeal which had subsequently been withdrawn by the Appellant, the consequences of this were relayed to the Licensing Committee.

Members of the Committee were reminded that details of compliance and enforcement were now broken down by area, Rhondda, Cynon and Taff which Members had previously found useful.

In conclusion, the Service Director Public Health & Protection presented the current position with regard to the recovery of annual fees under the Licensing Act 2003 before presenting issues under the Gambling Act 2005.

Further to questions posed by Committee and the responses received from the Service Director Public Health & Protection it was **RESOLVED**:-

- To note the contents of the report in respect of the Licensing Act 2003 which has been provided for information;
- II. To note the contents of the report in respect of the **Gambling Act 2005** which has been provided for information;

6. GAMBLING ACT 2005 REVIEW OF FEES OF DESIGNATED PREMISES

The Service Director Public Health & Protection presented his report with the purpose of appraising Members of a recent fees review conducted under the Gambling Act 2005, where the Licensing Authority is charged with such responsibility. It was reported that this is the first review conducted in Rhondda Cynon Taf since the fees were previously approved by members on the 14th May 2007. The Service Director Public Health & Protection stressed the importance of all Licensing Authorities setting their fees at the appropriate level and on a recovery basis only and how this is achieved by implementing the Institute of Licensing (IOL) Fees Toolkit.

Specific details were provided in relation to how the proposed fee structure for gambling premises licence is set within Rhondda Cynon Taf. Members were directed to Appendix 2C which set out the revised proposed Gambling Act fees structure.

In conclusion the Service Director, Public Health & Protection advised that although the review will result in a reduction in fees and income for the Local Authority Committee, there needs to be compliance with the legal requirements of the Gambling Act 2005 in order to avoid a potential legal challenge of the fees charged.

Following consideration of the report and questions posed by members of the Committee it was **RESOLVED** to:-

- I. . Note the findings of the review of discretionary fees under the Gambling Act 2005 undertaken by the Service Director of Public Health & Protection
- II. Accept the recommendation that the revised Fees are set out in Appendix 2C be amended and request the Service Director, Public Heath & Protection make the necessary arrangements to implement the decision.

7. EXCLUSION OF THE PRESS AND PUBLIC

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

The purpose of the report is to update Members on relevant issues, with regard to

- the Licensing Act 2003
- the Gambling Act 2005

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

3. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that a quarterly meeting is convened to review and discuss the implementation and progress of the Licensing Act 2003, together with any ancillary matters arising from responsibilities with which this particular Committee is charged.

Such ancillary matters include the Gambling Act 2005. (There may also be ancillary matters arising from the impact of the Smoke-Free Premises Regulations, which have the potential to affect all licensed premises).

4. <u>LICENSING ACT 2003</u>

4.1 Application Process

Applications received since the last update (27th June 2016 to 2nd October 2016) are as follows:-

The number of TEN's notifications reflect the number of fete's and/or Charitable events for the provision of alcohol sales or entertainment over the summer months. A number of the TEN's authorised additional hours for licensable activities for the August Bank Holiday period. Analysis of the TEN's applications indicate 24 were for Private Members Clubs, 28 for existing premises and 19 for community events.

Summary of TEN's, reproduced as Appendix 1A.

In accordance with the advice received in respect of data protection matters, the summaries of Personal Licences and Premises Licences issued under delegated authority are now reproduced for information as a Part II restricted item.

Post Office, 5-7 Mill Street, Pontypridd

The Premises Licence application of Afzal Shaheen t/a Global Link Associates was referred to the Sub Licensing Committee following Objections from South Wales Police, Trading Standards, Child Protection and the Licensing Authority. Members of the Sub Licensing Committee heard representations from the above and the Applicant and accompanying representatives.

Prior to the conclusion of the Hearing, the applicant announced to the Chairman that he wished to withdraw his application.

Nisa, 166 East Road, Tylorstown

The Premises Licence application of Mr Amandeep Singh and Mrs Putli Mukhtiar Singh was referred to the Sub Licensing Committee following a number of resident and one trade objection. A small number of residents attended the Hearing to address Members on their concerns about the granting of a new alcohol outlet in the Borough. Members heard that Responsible Authorities were satisfied that a Premises Licence could be granted subject to conditions agreed with the applicant, these included a reduction in the retail sale of alcohol times, provision of CCTV, minimum requirements relating to staffing, training and qualifications.

Following the Hearing, Members determined to grant the application subject to conditions put forward by the various Responsible Authorities.

The review was called by the Licensing Authority in its role as a Responsible Authority following information received from the authority's Youth Offending Service which identified that the premises had sold to an underage person, who in turn had proxy supplied alcohol to further underage individuals. The purpose of the Review application was to add additional conditions to assist the management in promoting the Licensing Objectives.

Following discussions with the applicant's representatives it was agreed that the conditions could be applied on the Premises licence by way of a Minor Variation application. The relevant application has been received and an amended licence in the process of being issued.

Appeals

There have been no appeals lodged or determined in the period.

4.5 Compliance & Enforcement

(i) Prosecutions/Infringements

Following an allegation that a Tonypandy 'on-licensed' premises was breaching its Premises Licence by virtue of unauthorised 'off sales' of alcohol Licensing Enforcement Officers arranged for a test purchase to be undertaken to verify the same.

A test purchase of a 35cl bottle of Gin confirmed the illegal activity was indeed taking place. Officers noted that the inference of the advertisements for the unauthorised off sales appeared to target individuals who planned to journey onwards to Cardiff by train.

Following an investigation, the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor both accepted formal Cautions in respect of offences under Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003.

(ii) Test Purchasing

Officers of the Licensing Team have conducted a test purchase in a premises holding a club premises certificate following complaints concerning access to non members, the supply of alcohol and provision of entertainment beyond permitted hours. This Club Premises will be subject to an infringement report.

Licensing Officers have also conducted a test purchase at a takeaway premises in the Beddau area, as they identified that the premises was trading in the absence of the appropriate licence. This matter has been dealt with via a first stage warning letter.

Trading Standards Officers have conducted 35 test purchases using underage volunteers in the period. This resulted in underage sales at 3 off licensed premises. Two of the sales took place in the Rhondda area, the remaining sale was in the Taff area. An Infringement report will be submitted in respect of each illegal sale.

In addition, Trading Standards Officers have conducted an exercise using a 19 year old male volunteer checking for compliance with conditions relating to Challenge 21 / 25 Age Verification. During this exercise each of the 14 premises visited correctly challenged or refused to sell to the volunteer in the absence of his identification.

(iii) Premises Inspection & Infringements

45 premises in the Borough were inspected in the last period.

A summary of infringements arising from inspection is reproduced as **Appendix 1B.**

One of the most common infringements related to licensees not being able to produce their Premises Licence at the time of the inspection and a failure to display the Licence Summary. These matters were dealt with by means of a warning letter. Officers identified that a number of licensees failed to have the required documented staff training records or refusals books in place or failing to ensure records were kept up to date. Officers identified further infringements including a lack or malfunctioning CCTV, an absence of Door supervisors and in one instance an absent DPS. In the case of the latter, the licensee was required to cease alcohol sales until the matter was rectified.

(iv) Complaints, Advice and Guidance

Cynon Valley

In the September meeting of Cynon Valley Pub Watch, members undertook training in the use of a defibrillator prior to one being sited outside a licensed premises in Aberdare.

A meeting has been held with a private members club in the Aberdare area in order to give advice on changing from their club premises certificate to a premises license and the application is awaited.

Following a premises inspection at premises in Aberaman, it was found that there had been major alterations to the premises. Officers ensured that the required full variation application was submitted.

A named Designated Premises Supervisor at a premises in Aberaman was found to be absent and therefore not to be in day to day control of the premises following a premises inspection. This has resulted in an application being received to vary the designated premises supervisor.

As detailed in the July 2016 report, advice was provided to a prospective licensee regarding a premises reopening in Cwmbach. Following a visit to the premises, officers established that there had been major alterations to the premises, which has subsequently resulted in a full variation application being received.

Following a visit to a premises in Abernant, it was noted that some alteration had been made to the premises and a minor variation application has been submitted.

Following a report being received from the Fire Officer regarding the condition of a premises in Trecynon, officers conducted a premises inspection. At the time of the inspection, it was noted that the premises complied with its conditions under the Licensing Act 2003.

Licensing Officers have assisted in the setting up of a new pub watch in the Mountain Ash area. The first meeting was held at the club premises of Mountain Ash Rugby club. The pubwatch will include licensees from 'On licensed', Club Premises and Off licences. To date 12 premises have agreed to join the pubwatch scheme.

Premises which failed to attend the pubwatch meeting have been visited by Officers to encourage greater participation.

Rhondda

Following a complaint received from a local resident, a meeting was arranged with Police Licensing and committee members of a Workingman's Club in Porth. CCTV was viewed and advice given but no further action was necessary.

A meeting was arranged with the committee and trusties at a local Miners Institute to discuss how best to promote their facilities within the confines of a Club Premises Certificate (CPC) and the possibility of applying for a premises licence.

Officers took part in a meeting with Police Licensing, ASB Officers, local PCSO's and licensee at an Ystrad Club to discuss a complaint from a local resident alleging homophobic abuse from club members. It was disclosed at the meeting that the premises was no longer operating as a Club and a Closure Notice was subsequently issued. A Full Variation for a Premises Licence application has since been received. Officers will continue to liase with South Wales Police regarding the concerns of the local resident.

Following reports of anti social behaviour arising from patrons of a late night venue in Pentre. The Licensee has agreed to install shutters on the home of the complainant to help prevent nuisance arising.

Taff Area

An application was received for a new premises license in Taff Street Pontypridd. Following a number of representations from Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties, the application was withdrawn.

Officers have worked closely with Victim Support Officers to install noise monitoring equipment at a Llantrisant resident's home following Music and patron noise complaints. Officers have met with the Licensee of the premises allegedly the cause of the complaint to provide suitable advice.

Officers have met with a club premises in Taffs Well to discuss the possibility and benefits of applying for a Premises Licence.

Several breaches of licence were identified at a licensed late night refreshment establishment in Pontypridd. Following advice, the licensee has since submitted an application for a full variation.

Licensing Officers have assisted in setting up a new Pubwatch in the Pontyclun area. Whilst still in its infancy the meetings will give Officers from the Licensing Authority and Police the opportunity to provide advice and guidance to licensees.

(iv) Community Alcohol Partnership (CAP) - Porth

Officers of the Community Safety Partnership, Licensing, Trading Standards in partnership with South Wales Police have secured funding from The Community Alcohol Partnership to tackle the issue of underage drinking in the area. The partnership involves local residents, alcohol outlets and young people.

Community Alcohol Partnership (CAP) activity will always be locally determined but will generally encourage and include a focus on education, enforcement, public perception, communication, diversionary

activity and evaluation. The Funding secured will assist the partners in delivering within these core areas.

Education is key to raising awareness about the law relating to young people and alcohol and the impact of underage alcohol consumption on individuals and society. CAP encourages education of young people, adults and retailers.

An essential part of CAP involves enforcement of the laws relating to young people and alcohol including purchase of alcohol by under 18s, sale to under 18s, drinking by under 18s in public places and proxy or agent purchase. Compliance testing is an integral part of any CAP and usually takes place several times in the life of a CAP to provide benchmarking activity and monitor the success, or otherwise, of retailer training.

It is important that where schemes are successful in reducing crime and anti-social behaviour in a designated area, local people feel safer as a result. Surveys of residents in Porth will be carried out prior to and after the pilot phase are a good way to gauge any changes in public opinion.

CAP has developed a range of materials which can be adapted as required to suit the needs of local schemes in this instance Porth. Schemes are encouraged to make use of these communication tools and to make use also of local radio, local press, social networking media, residents' meetings etc - to try and ensure that the community understands CAP and is fully engaged and involved.

It is hoped the funding can provide a range of activities for young people to ensure that young people have fun and have healthy things to do that do not involve alcohol. Diversionary activities in other areas have included provision of sports using existing leisure and sports facilities, using youth clubs or "Youth buses" and local cafes to provide opportunities for young people to drop in and meet in a supervised, safe environment.

Evaluation is a mandatory part of each CAP scheme. Examples of evaluated data includes local crime and anti-social behaviour statistics, levels of alcohol-related litter, hotspot drinking areas, complaints and incidents reported to partner agencies, ambulance pick-ups for underage alcohol related incidents, hospital admission for under 18s and public perception surveys. The measurement of progress throughout the pilot allows the management team to monitor effectiveness of the action plan activities, and provides firm data for final evaluation.

The Launch of the Porth CAP Project will take place at 'The Factory' in Porth on the 15th November 2016, which also coincides with Alcohol Awareness Week. An update on the scheme will be provided for Members in future reports.

5.2 Enforcement

Licensing Enforcement Officers received a complaint concerning the siting of two illegal Gaming machines in an off licence premises in the Treorchy area. Officers attended the premises and confirmed that the machines were illegally sited. The Licensee of the premises removed the machines with immediate effect and was provided with suitable advice. The matter was reported to the Gambling Commission for their information.

Officers have visited a licensed premises in Treforest to provide advice concerning illegal gambling in licensed premises, following a referral from the Gambling Commission. The Licensee denied the allegations attributed to the Premises. Officers provided written advice and guidance concerning Gambling in pubs and will monitor the premises for further complaints.

5.3 Recovery of Annual Fees

As a result of the static nature of the trade, there is little change to the position, where 100% recovery of annual fees is the standard, primarily due to the robust provisions contained within the legislation which allow for withdrawal of the licence/permit for non-payment of appropriate fees.




