- Elected by residents of the local area to serve 5-year terms
- · Act as political spokesperson for their community
- · Get involved in democracy by contacting your Councillor


BECOME A COUNCILLOR

Scrutiny Committees are open to the public and consider Council services and key decisions made by elected Members. RCT has 4 key scrutiny committees, each with their own yearly Work Programme. By getting involved, you can help populate these



PETITIONS

Individuals, community groups, and organisations all have right to organise petitions to raise issues of public concern.



OUESTIONS

All residents have the right to apply for time to speak in public meetings and ask elected Members questions about agenda items they are passionate about.

In the 2022 Local Elections only 35.5% of RCT's residents participated, just over 1/3.

The easiest way people can engage in democracy is by voting. Having your say means you can make positive contributions to your community.

You can register to vote in Wales from 14, and vote in local government and Senedd elections when you are 16.



YOUNG **PEOPLE**

The Council has a Youth Forum run by the Youth Engagement and Participation Service (YEPS). They offer a range of free activities for people aged 11-25, encouraging young people to get involved in their community.



CITIZENS' PANEL



Our Citizens' Panel allows residents to participate more actively in democracy by sharing the needs, views, experiences, and expectations of the community with the Council. This is a great opportunity to shape the way the Council runs.
