Our performance compared to the rest of Wales in 2016/17

In summary, of the 24 national indicators and measures where we can compare our 2016/17 data:

- We were among the best in Wales for 4 out of 24 indicators.
- Overall, 14 indicators showed that performance has improved and 7 of these were better than the Wales average
- There are 5 indicators that are amongst the worst in Wales despite improved performance
- 8 of our indicators showed that performance has declined from last year but 4 of these are still better than the Wales Average
- Performance in 2 of our indicators stayed the same.

To summarise, comparing our performance against other Welsh councils we were among the worst in Wales for:

- The number of visits to Public Libraries
- Issuing final statements of special education need within 26 weeks. However, in RCT residents get a service without the need for a statement. This provides a better service but isn't shown in the national figures.
- Pupil attendance in primary schools
- The number of visits to local authority sports and leisure facilities
- The percentage of food establishments which are 'broadly compliant' with food hygiene standards
- % of pupils aged 15 at the start of the academic year who achieved L2 threshold including a GCSE grade A*-C in English or Welsh (first language) and Maths
- % of pupils assessed at the end of Key Stage 3, in schools maintained by the local authority, achieving the Core Subject Indicator, as determined by Teacher Assessment

We were among the best in Wales for

- The percentage of residents over 60 that have a concessionary bus pass
- The percentage of highways inspected of a high or acceptable standard of cleanliness
- The percentage of municipal waste sent to landfill
- The percentage of pupils in local authority care and in any local authority maintained schools aged 15 who leave compulsory education, training or work based learning without an approved external qualification

Comparing our performance against our 2016/17 targets,

- 14 indicators met or exceeded our targets, although performance of 3 indicators was worse than the Wales average
- 9 indicators missed the target, 8 of which were worse than the Wales average

We have set ourselves performance targets for 2017/18, some of which drive improvement and some aim to keep the same level of service with reduced resources. However, performance indicators are not the only measure of the services we provide, nor do they tell the whole story, but they can help. Comparing our performance with other councils can raise more questions than answers. This is positive as it can help us to better understand what we do, learn from better practice as well as provide us with an indication on how well we are performing. If we can see that our performance is not improving over time and remains below the Welsh Average without good reason, we can then focus on what we need to do to improve.
