Our budget



We want increase **Council Tax** by **2.85%** next year.



Council Tax is money you have to give to your local authority to pay for things like schools, roads, social services and parks.



We had the **lowest** increase in Council Tax in Wales last year. Most other places in Wales increased their council tax by nearly 5%

We would like to increase Council Tax by **2.85%** next year.

This means that if your Council Tax was £1,000 this year, you will have to pay about £28 more next year. Or 55p more a week.

For example, we spent over £1 million last year to support people and fix things after Storm Dennis.



We have just under £9 million in reserves now. We will keep checking this. We will keep thinking about the risks we may face. And we will add more money to it to make sure we always have enough money in reserves.


