(WAITING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2021

STATEMENT OF REASONS

During the construction of the Mountain Ash Cross Valley Link, waiting restrictions were introduced in Glyngwyn Street and Bailey Street on a temporary basis to assist with traffic flow.

Following completion of the works, residents were consulted on whether they would like the restrictions to remain or alternatively have them removed.

The results of the consultation showed support for the removal of the waiting restrictions in Glyngwyn Street however there was support to keep the restrictions in Bailey Street and at the junction of Glyngwyn Street and Bailey Street.

These measures are proposed under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to facilitate the passage of traffic, prevent the likelihood of danger and to improve safety for all highway users
