Carers Rights Day - Know your rights

Every year, more than 2 million people take on a new caring role. Many struggle to navigate the maze of services and entitlements, and miss out on financial and practical support as a result. And it's not just people who are new to caring even those who have been caring for vears sometimes aren't aware of all their entitlements.

When you're caring, getting the right information at the right time can make all the difference.

Carers Rights Day aims to raise awareness about this. It is important that every Carer knows where to turn for advice, information and support, in their community and online.

This year we are holding 2 events to celebrate Carers Rights Day 2016:

Carers are invited to join us on Tuesday 22nd November to learn more about their rights as a carer and to access good quality information and advice that can support them to continue caring. Speakers during the morning will include representatives from Carers Wales, who will be talking about Carers' rights and the new Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act, Dewis Cymru, which is the new place to access information about wellbeing in Wales, Supporting people team who provide housing related services for vulnerable people and up to date legal information of interest to Carers.

After a morning of talks, Carers will be able to get together and enjoy a 2course lunch.

For Young Carers and Young Adult Carers (aged up to 25) we are holding a Recognition evening on Friday 25th November, where the young people will have an opportunity to come together and showcase their talents. It is also an opportunity to recognise the important role that these young people undertake on a daily basis.

CADW Wales

Carers go free • Guide dogs and assistance dogs permitted

Cadw is the Welsh Government's historic environment service.

It has responsibility for 128 castles, abbeys, churches, chapels and other historic monuments.

Each disabled visitor and companion or carer will be admitted free of charge to all monuments

Access to some properties is limited to the ground floor for those with limited mobility.

Disabled toilets, disabled parking and motorised scooters/wheelchairs for hire are available at some sites.

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CARD

The CEA Card is a national card scheme developed for UK cinemas by the UK Cinema Association (UKCA), formerly the Cinema Exhibitors' Association (CEA). The CEA Card allows a disabled guest to obtain ONE free ticket for the person who is accompanying them, to enable them to visit the cinema, by providing the assistance they require as a result of their disability. The card is issued to the person who requires assistance to visit a cinema so they are not restricted to naming a particular carer; a different person can accompany them each time they visit. The card costs £6 and is valid for a year.

WaterSure Wales

WaterSure Wales is one of the schemes that Dwr Cymru Welsh Water offer to make bills more affordable.


The scheme is available to all household customers who have a water meter fitted. It helps low income households who have either a large family, or a family member with a medical condition that requires the use of a significant amount of extra water. The WaterSure Wales charges are £139.00 for water and £200.00 for sewerage for the period 1st April 2016 to 31st March 2017. If your application is successful, the reduced charge will be applied to your account from 1st of April or your occupation date, whichever is the latest

Assessments: a Carer

A guide to getting an assessment in Wales from April 2016



The Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act 2014 came into force on 6 April 2016. The Act repeals the majority of previous community care legislation and intends to transform the way that social services are delivered in Wales.

For the first time, carers will have the same rights as

those they care for. The Act introduces a new broader definition of a carer, a duty on local authorities to offer carers their own needs assessment as well as a legal duty to meet the eligible needs of carers following assessment.

Carers Wales have produced a new factsheet outlining what a Carer's Needs Assessment is, how to request one and what help might be available. The factsheet can be downloaded from their website:

Tips from a Carer

What would you grab if you heard a fire alarm?

Recently we were staying in a hotel which was originally built for people who were blind or had impaired vision. We like it as we have a ground floor room with wet room facilities and a fire exit right next to the room.

During our stay the fire alarm went off and I grabbed my husband and his walking sticks, wheelchair and handbag containing our essential items.

It was a false alarm caused by someone using hairspray in a steamy bathroom!!

However, it made me think that other Carers might not be prepared in this situation so I put together a list of things that I always do, having been in many hotels when fire alarms are activated.

- Get my husband up and grab his shoes and put him in his wheelchair.
- I always have a torch on the bedside table and memorise the exit doors on arrival.
- My bag is kept by the bedside and contains car keys, copies of prescriptions, daily medication, phone, purse, diary and people contact list, glasses, hearing aids and batteries. I also carry my CARER'S EMERGENCY CARD which has my husband's details (available from RCT – contact the Carers Project at Heddfan, Pontypridd on 01443 668813)
- Have our coats hanging near the door and not in the wardrobe so they are easy to locate if the lights go out, and
- Always leave the DOOR KEY IN THE LOCK.

I can assure you that I AM NOT PARANOID, just a carer who has had to do this type of evacuation a few times over the years.

What would you grab?





Simon Lea, manager of the Asda Living store at the Cheetham Hill complex, came up with the idea to helping people who felt intimidated or stressed by noise and disturbance. And his idea for a super-quiet shopping environment struck a chord with thousands of people around the country with autism or other conditions and their families.

The store recently staged its first-ever quiet hour which saw escalators, in-store music turned down and display TVs switched off. Autistic and other disabled customers were given a map of the store featuring pictures instead of words when the store opened at 8am - an hour early - on Saturday.

A delighted Mum who visited the store with her daughter, posted her praise on Manchester Fort's Facebook site: "My daughter and myself came in this morning to get a school skirt and what a huge and positive impact your store and more importantly your manager and staff have had on my daughter this morning. She not only managed without her wheelchair and ear defenders but she coped and didn't go into crisis. This for us is huge. No head banging, biting or screaming."

Praising the scheme, Mark Lever, CEO of The National Autistic Society, said: "We've recently launched our biggest ever awareness campaign called Too Much Information, so people can learn about autism and feel encouraged to respond with the same kind of understanding shown by Simon and Asda."


