The Blueprint Forum is a group of 14-22 year olds who are or have been looked after in Rhondda Cynon Taf. (R.C.T.).



The group gives young people the chance to discuss the key issues to young people who are or have been looked after. Our main focus is promoting the rights of young people in RCT and highlight the opportunities there are for young people in RCT.

We have participated in several consultations and launch events with The Fostering Network, the Children's Commissioner For Wales and Children in Wales and we work very closely with R.C.T. Corporate Parenting Board, as well as taking part in Voices From Care's national activities.

The Blueprint Forum has two trips for members per year one in the summer and one in the winter. This year our members enjoyed a day out to Go Ape and the Swimming/surfing centre in Swansea, as well as ice skating and a Christmas meal at Frankie and Bennies.

### Tuna and sweet potato jackets for 2.

Ingredients: 2 small sweet potatoes, 185g can of tuna drained, ½ red onion chopped up, juice of 1

lime, handful of coriander leaves.

Method: Wash sweet potatoes and prick with a fork. Place on a microwaveable plate and cook on high for 18-20 minutes, or until tender.

Split in half and place each one (cut-side up) on a serving plate. Flake drained tuna with a fork and divide between sweet potatoes. Squeeze lime juice over the potato jackets and add coriander.

Veggie option: Replace tuna with feta cheese.

#### Ham and cheese omelette

Ingredients: 2 eggs, 50ml milk, 1 slice of ham, margarine, cheddar cheese.

**Method**: Wash and slice ham. In a bowl, combine eggs, ham, milk, salt and pepper then mix together well. Heat frying pan on medium and melt margarine.

As the omelette begins to set, lift up edges with a spatula, so

uncooked portion of egg can flow under the cooked portion.

When eggs are set, sprinkle ¾ of the cheese over it. Fold one edge of the omelet over the cheese, then sprinkle the rest of the cheese over the top. Slide omelet onto the plate and cut into portions.





Recently the Blueprint Forum has had the opportunity to work on the Looked After information packs that all young people in RCT get. The group looked at the layout of the packs, information booklets and who young people can contacts. We also had a look at the design and feel of the information in the packs, with the aim of using our experiences to make the packs more useful to young people when they first enter care.

All the views and work completed by blueprint will be given to the council and will be taken into consideration when they develop the next generation of information packs for young people.



The Blueprint Forum have been contacted by the office of The Children's Commissioner for Wales and have been asked for our views on the new my planner app that they are developing.

Blueprint Forum is also looking into a Young Person Representatives and group mentoring scheme that will give the young people at blueprint more say and ownership of their group.

And finally, the CHRISTMAS trip is coming soon, get involved and have your say on what we do this year. All trips are completely FREE to members of the blueprint forum.




The Blueprint Forum was then invited to present a charter and video to RCT's Corporate Parenting panel on our views on corporate parenting.
