CIL Draft Charging Schedule

Thank you for your letter of 24 June consulting The Theatres Trust on the draft charging schedule for the Community Infrastructure Levy.

Thank you for confirming in the Report of Responses that theatres will not be charged for CIL. However, the Draft document does not contain as much information as the Preliminary document. For instance, the Preliminary document showed an example of a CIL charge for pubs in Table 4 on page 13 which is A4 Use Class, but this Use Class does not appear in Table 1 of charges in the Draft document. Paragraph 4.4 of the Draft document advises that A1, A3 and only D1 Primary Healthcare will be charged – no other use within D1. There is no statement of a nil charge for any other Use Classes or infrastructure types.
