

# 2023 Grants Guide

## Sport Wales Be Active Wales Fund

- The Be Active Wales Fund offers grants from £300 to £50,000 for projects in Wales that intend to do at least one of the following: reduce inequality, create long-term sustainability, introduce new or different ways of operating.
- You are eligible if you're a not-for-profit or community organization with a project that has not started yet.
- The funding is awarded on a sliding scale: 100% grant up to £10,000, 90% grant for awards between £10,001 and £25,000, 80% grant for awards between £25,001 and £50,000.

## Crowdfunder – A Place for Sport

- Sport Wales has partnered with Crowdfunder to support community clubs and activities to raise money for facility improvements. The scheme is for not-for-profit clubs and community groups looking to raise money for 'off-field' improvements. For example: changing rooms, clubhouse renovations, solar panels, new fencing.
- Clubs and organisations set up a page on the Crowdfunder website, which asks people to pledge money
  to the cause or idea. These ideas would benefit the local community by improving facilities. Crowfunder
  provide support and advice, including a coach to guide you through the process where appropriate. Your
  project is assessed by Sport Wales, who can decide what level of match-funding you'll be eligible for
  based on the information you've provided. If the Crowdfunder page has reached certain criteria, Sport
  Wales will match fund between 30% and 50% of the total, up to a maximum of £15,000 match-funding.

# Welsh Church Act Fund (administered by Rhondda Cynon Taf CBC Regeneration and Planning)

- It provides support for capital expenditure such as: refurbishment of a community building, purchase of capital equipment. Available to constituted community groups and charities. Facilities must be open to members of the public at large.
- Small grants (up to £2,000) require no contribution from the applicant. Medium grants (up to £10,000) require a 10% contribution from the applicant. Large grants (up to £50,000) require a 20% contribution from the applicant.

## **Coalfields Community Grant (Wales)**

- Grants from £500 to £7,000 available to community and voluntary organisations that can demonstrate strongly that a grant will impact positively on people living in the Coalfield communities of Wales.
- Applications must evidence that they meet at least one of the following themes: Skills and training, Community buildings, Tackling poverty, Health and well-being.

## <u>'Game On Gear' Cymru Kit grant – with the support of Coalfields Regeneration Trust</u>

- The aim of this fund is to get more young people (aged 13-19) from Welsh Coalfield communities to play sport. They fund sports kit to a maximum value of £500.

- Supported by the Pen Y Cymoedd Wind Energy Project. Applications are open to specific areas of Rhondda Cynon Taf. Two grants available: the Micro Fund (up to £5,000) and the Vision Fund (over £5,000).

# Postcode Community Trust

- Constituted community or voluntary groups are eligible to apply for up to £2,000 to support projects under 8 themes which include: improving mental well-being, Preventing or reducing the impact of poverty, Supporting marginalised groups and promoting equality, Enabling participation in physical activity, Increasing community access to outdoor space.

## Millennium Stadium Charitable Trust

- The trust provides support to inspiring projects throughout Wales
- There is a regional grant which welcome sport based applications. This grant is up to £7,500 and supports organisations that provide a service to a region.

## National Lottery Awards for All Wales

- The main aim of the programme is to fund projects which involve people in their local community, bringing them together to take part in and enjoy a wide range of heritage, charitable, health, educational, environmental and other community activities.

## TNL Community Fund - People and Places

- There are two levels to this funding: Medium (£10,001 to £100,000) and Large (£100,001 to £500,000)
- Grants are available to voluntary, community or public sector organisations. It can fund capital and revenue costs.

## Community Facilities Programme offered by Welsh Government

- Grants are available at two levels: small grants under £25,000 and larger grants up to £250,000.
