Sport RCT Community Sport Fund

- This fund is available for any Sport RCT Accredited community sport club or community group in RCT that requires support to develop existing or start new sporting opportunities. This fund is for essential and/or basic start-up costs up to approximately £500. For larger projects we will work with you to apply for external funding such as the Sport Wales Be Active Wales Fund. This fund is open all year round and decisions are usually made within a 2 week period.

Sport Wales Be Active Wales Fund

- The Be Active Wales Fund is a grant supported by the National Lottery. It funds not-for-profit sports clubs and community groups across Wales. You can apply for grants from £300 to £50,000 to get more people taking part in sport.
- The fund supports equipment, coaching courses, venue hire and pitch improvements.
- £300 - £25,000: Sport Wales will fund up to 90% of the project costs. You will fund the rest.
- £25,001 - £50,000: Sport Wales will fund up to 80% of the project costs. You will fund the rest.
- Some specific items may only get 50% funding or have financial limits.
- There will be three windows of opportunity to apply this year:

Sport Wales A Place for Sport – Crowdfunder

- Sport Wales has partnered with Crowdfunder to support community clubs raise money to improve their facilities. The scheme is for not-for-profit clubs and community groups looking to raise money for 'off-field' improvements. For example: changing rooms, toilets, clubhouse renovations, solar panels, new fencing, kitchen and bar areas, pitch maintenance tools.
- Clubs and organisations set up a page on the Crowdfunder website, where people donate money to support good causes and projects. You can create a fundraising page for your club and share it with your members and local community. Crowdfunder provide support and advice, including a coach to guide you through the process where appropriate. Your project is assessed by Sport Wales, who can decide what level of match-funding you'll be eligible for based on the information you've provided. If the Crowdfunder page has reached certain criteria, Sport Wales will match fund up to 60% of your target up to a maximum of £15,000 match-funding.

Welsh Church Act Fund (administered by Rhondda Cynon Taf CBC Regeneration and Planning)

- It provides support for capital expenditure such as: refurbishment of a community building, purchase of capital equipment or purposes beneficial to the wider community. Available to constituted community groups and charities. Facilities must be open to members of the public at large. Organisations that are either licensed to sell alcohol, have a club premises certificate, operate from a residential address are unable to apply.
- Small grants (up to £3,000) require no contribution from the applicant. Medium grants (up to £15,000) require a 10% contribution from the applicant. Large grants (up to £50,000) require a 20% contribution from the applicant.
- The fund operates on a rolling programme basis. There are no set bidding rounds and fully developed applications can be submitted at any time.

Pen Y Cymoedd Community Fund

- Supported by the Pen Y Cymoedd Wind Energy Project. Applications are open to specific areas of Rhondda Cynon Taf. Applications are open to specific areas of the Rhondda and Cynon valleys. - There are two rounds of Micro Fund per year – dates to be announced.
- The Vision Fund offers grants over £6,500 (capital and/or revenue) to support activities that help to deliver one or more of the priorities set out in the Fund Prospectus. New and developing businesses, voluntary sector and community groups can all apply. Although public sector bodies are not eligible, we welcome partnership working.

Coalfields Community Grant (Wales)

- Grants from £500 to £7,000 available to community and voluntary organisations that can demonstrate strongly that a grant will impact positively on people living in the Coalfield communities of Wales. Please check before applying via this [link](#).
- The aim of this programme is to support community and voluntary organisations, who manage community facilities, to access funding required to: safeguard; maintain; and/or improve their community facility.

CRT Game On – Wales Kit Grant

- The aim of the grant is to get more people living in coalfield communities in Wales (ages 13 – 19) to play and stay in sport. Sport Wales statistics highlight an alarming drop off of registered players during these teenage years. Maximum value of £750 for sports kit. Community Facilities Programme offered by Welsh Government

- It is a capital grant scheme that can be used to improve community facilities which are useful to, and well used by, people in the community. It is open to community and voluntary groups, including social enterprises.

- Fund outcomes include: improving people's chances in life, building stronger communities, encouraging healthier and more active people and communities.
- Grants of between £500 – £2,000 per annum for up to 3 years, are available to organisations whose applications best deliver against the outcomes above.
- Fund for Wales will be open for a six-month period, with panel meetings held towards the end of each month to review applications and distribute funding on a rolling basis (subject to change).

Payment is for individuals therefore teams/groups should not apply. Grants provided by The Foundation are limited to no more than £500 per individual so that we can spread our funds widely to the neediest individuals.

The Landfill Disposals Tax Communities Scheme – WCVA

- The Landfill Disposals Tax Communities Scheme is a Welsh Government grant scheme administered by WCVA. Its objective is to provide grant funding for communities living near a landfill site or waste transfer station. Grants have been used previously to improve the energy efficiency in their clubhouse alongside upgrades to the building to engage their community. Organisations can apply for grants of £5,000 to £49,999.

Key Tips when Applying for Funding

- Include our team in your funding application; we can help with guidance or a letter of support
- Check the grant criteria for eligibility [what you're asking for, demographic, capital vs project requests]
- Consider the funder's priorities [tackling inequalities, community benefit]
- Evidence the need for your request [areas of deprivation, demand in community]
- Show community impact [wider than what's happening on the pitch]
- Demonstrate strong governance [club structure, documents and history]
- Think about match funding or utilising other options where repeat funding is not available with your previous funder.
